Miners in Fearful Peril But Finally Escaped.

SCRANTON, Pa., Nov. 15.—A break occurred in the great pumps that cast out thousands of gallons of water from the Leggett creek coal mine, and the mine began to flood. Fifty miners hurried to reach the surface, which conveyed them to the surface, but found that their avenue of escape had been cut off.

When near the top of the shaft a car of coal which was being taken out had rolled from the carriage and fallen hundreds of feet. The carriage, freed of its burden, had rushed to the top of the shaft and had become immovable in the tower.

MEXICAN INCIVILITY

American Citizens Arrested Without Cause.

DISCHARGED, NO APOLOGY.

A Drunken Captain Causes the Outrage—It Will Be Looked Into and Punished.

RIO GRANDE CITY, Nov. 16.—Captain John G. Bourke, of Fort Kingbird, and Deputy United States Marshal John Jordan, arrived here at 2 P. M. November 14, after thirty-six hours' arrest at Pecos and Cerralvo, Mexico. They made the trip from Cerralvo in seven hours, ninety-seven miles, their treatment in Mexico making them anxious to leave it promptly. Their coming was a great surprise, as two hours before a telegram was received telling of their arrest, with a request for aid. Wednesday, November 11, they crossed into Mexico from Carrizo on a government backboard with four mules, driven by Arnold, a no-ed old army man, with a permit from the deputy collector at Carrizo, Tex., and the Mexican on house office at passing them to Guerrero without objection, at which point they were unharmed and treated with much consideration by officials and citizens. At Pecos, thirty miles from Guerrero, a drunken militia man, a state ranger, arrested them on suspicion and would listen to no explanation. In this place they were under guard three hours. Thence they were taken under guard to Aguila, Texas, on the 12th. They were arrested on the 13th by the judge, who treated them considerately. While the prisoners were there a cavalry battalion and infantry company arrived from Monterey. At 8 in the morning they were started to Cerralvo, reaching it at noon. There it became evident that they were held as revolutionary suspects on information given by the ranger, who constantly followed them during the time they were under arrest, but no information was given them for the reason of their detention, although often asked for. At Cerralvo the guards made plans of them with much anxiety, and at 5 P. M. Captain Bourke wired the arrest to Consul General Sutton, at London, from whom, at 8 P. M., came the answer that he had taken prompt measures for their release. They were told by the judge that they would all be released in the morning, but the prisoners insisted on immediate release on the telegram, which was granted at 8:30 P. M. without any apology from the officials. They reached Mer at 7 A. M. yesterday. General Lorenzo Garcia, who expressed great regret for the arrest, stating that all the parties engaged in it would be punished, the ranger especially.

CHINESE MATTERS.

The Rebels Gaining Ground in Their Action.

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 16.—The Chronicle's correspondent at Shanghai says: "The capture of Tehwai, near Foo Choo, on Tuesday, by 15,000 rebels was a well organized rising, the rebels being armed with repeaters and led by capable men. The outbreak was directed against the authorities, and although anti-foreign in character, it is a notorious fact that the real culprits are still free, being protected against arrest by exalted officials. Agents of the Peking treasury have paid the indemnities agreed upon, £2000, to the sufferers at Wuchai, and £4000 to the families of Europeans killed at Wussieh. The American mission's secretary has expressed the opinion that trouble will be renewed next spring."

MAINE TROUBLE IN RUSSIA.

A Conspiracy to Create a Representative Assembly.

LONDON, Nov. 16.—A widespread conspiracy to create a representative assembly has been discovered in Russia, Moscow is the center. The authorities there are becoming more and more suspicious as the internal situation of the empire continues to grow more critical. There is considerable uneasiness regarding the status of affairs throughout the empire. As a result of this feeling the marshals of the nobility exercising power and residing in different parts of the country have been warned that they will be held responsible for any manifestation of political feeling against the government which may occur in the provinces under their control.

The conductors and brakemen have several grievances against the road, and among other things demand an increase of wages and a reduction in the number of hours. The company refuses to accede to the demands. A meeting will be held next Wednesday at which it is said the employees will declare a strike.

DRIVING GERMANS OUT OF RUSSIA.

VIENNA, Nov. 16.—Accounts from the interior of Russia say that a general exodus is being made of Germans, who for a century past have had a leading share in the development of the industrial welfare of that country. There is reason to believe that the Russian government, anticipating war with Germany sooner or later, has determined to rid itself of those who by their natural sympathies would be inclined to the German side. The Germans are not harassed in the same degree as the Jews, but are made to do a certain amount of military service, and are being expelled from the Russian faith. Altogether, the situation of Germans in Russia is fast becoming intolerable.

PROBABLY THE WRONG MAN.

GALENA, Ill., Nov. 16.—Ralph White, one of the men held at Racine, Wis., under suspicion of being implicated in the train robbery at Western Union Junction, is a member of one of the best and wealthiest families in this county, being a son of J. W. White, president of the Hanover Wool Company, and nephew of Senator Cheney, of New Hampshire. He is well known here as an excellent young man, with a passion for hunting. He left home a week ago to indulge it with his cousin Henderson, who is also favorably known here. Their friends scoff at the idea that they had anything to do with the robbery.

A TORNADO IN BRAZIL.

NEW YORK, Nov. 16.—A Buenos Ayres dispatch states a tornado passed over the province of Santa Fe Friday night. The town of Arroyo Seco was entirely destroyed, forty people being killed and thirty wounded. A train of eighteen coaches was overturned and many passengers buried in the wreck. The telegraph wires are down and details of the disaster are meager. Crops are badly damaged. The province of Santa Fe has a population of about 100,000, and contains 38,000 square miles.

HE PLAYED TOO MUCH FARE.

CARSON, Nev., Nov. 16.—Arthur Leonard, clerk of Wells, Fargo & Co.'s express company, has been arrested on a charge of embezzling \$200. Leonard has been running with a high hand and lost heavily at faro—\$1000 in one night, \$800 in another and all in three weeks. He is bonded by the Pacific Surety company, of San Francisco, whose agent is now in Carson.

FATAL RAILROAD ACCIDENT.

LIMA, O., Nov. 16.—A south-bound passenger train on the Cincinnati, Hamilton & Dayton railway was wrecked at this place this morning. The engine left the track while running through a switch. The engineer, Samuel Hatch, and the firemen were badly injured.
