FAMINE LEADS ON TO WAR.

Such seems to be the verdict in regard to the situation in Europe, as far as the influence of Russia leads on to war, at least. And it is the Russian predominance in European politics that means war if war is to come.

Mr. Abbott says that really the only thing that can save Russia from a revolution during the winter is war. The Emperor of Russia sees this, and the disturbance of Europe's peace will come through his orders.

The chronicler still further thinks that this practical view of the situation is diametrically opposed to De Giers assurance, to the Emperor of Germany that the understanding between Russia and France involves nothing that might be construed as a menace to other countries.

As between revolution and war Russia would certainly choose war, and it looks as though the exercise of the option would be forced upon her. The hungry peasants of Russia cannot draw fine distinctions, and if they believe that the rulers and nobility in Moscow and St. Petersburg and other cities of the empire are living in luxury while they, the peasants, are starving, they will be certain to revolt, unless a foreign war shall intervene to cause them to rally to the support of the Czar against the enemies of Holy Russia, as the peasants call it.

It took a nineteen year old girl in West Virginia but a short time to outwit several Mormon elders and her parents. The family, quite a wealthy one, had succumbed to the persuasive eloquence of the Mormon elders, and joined that peculiar denomination, and started for Utah with the elders. change of a single cent a bushel in the price of corn or wheat may mean wealth or penury to the man who speculates, but it does not change the price of flour or cornmeal to the consumer. The advantage which the American farmer has this year is not due to the victory of the bulls over the bears in the Chicago grain exchanges, but to the scarcity of food supplies in Europe. At the same time the advance in corn, if it does make any difference at all, must assist the farmer, for the real value of his product must sympathize to a certain extent with imaginary value which is put upon it by the Chicago speculators.

PECULIARITIES in the ideas entertained by human beings, from different standpoints of view at different times, are often observable. One of these is commented upon by the New York Tribune in its remarks on the fact that the Irishmen of America selected Chauncey Depew to deliver a eulogy on the late leader, Parnell, although nine in ten Irish-Americans are Democrats. There is nothing strange about the selection. Mr. Depew as a republican is naturally in sympathy with the home rule movement, while American democrats to a man lean the other way.
