**Local News.**

**The Harvest.**

The showers of this week stopped work in the harvest field, to the detriment of farmers. There is some wheat and a great deal of the oat crop unthreshed. If this weather should hold through the present week a good deal of grain will be damaged. T. G. Todd, the Gleason brothers, Mr. Alexander and several farmers on the south side of Gale's creek, on the Tualatin river, and Wapato lake have large fields of wheat standing out, some of it not cut and some in the shock. The rain Sunday night was light and some began to thresh again Monday evening, but rain came again Monday and Tuesday nights with cloudy weather during the day time and now it would take a day or two of sunshine before work could begin. Mr. Alexander who lives some two miles southwest of the Grove has all of his spring crop in the shock yet. Mr. Todd wanted to thresh it last Sunday but Mr. Alexander desired to wait and we fear now that the wheat will suffer damage. Most all of the wheat crop is threshed however and the loss if any will be mostly confined to late cuts.

**PROSPEROUS.**—The number of students matriculating in the College and Academy is larger than ever before at this time of the year. This is particularly cheering when we consider that harvest is much later this season than common, and that there has been a change in the teachers in the Academy. **An Act to Amend Forest Grove Charter.**

AN ACT TO AMEND AN ACT ENTITLED AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE TOWN OF FOREST GROVE APPROVED OCTOBER 5TH, 1874.  
SEC. 1. Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon: That the act entitled an Act to incorporate the Town of Forest Grove, in the county of Washington be amended by adding thereto sections eleven and twelve as follows:  
SEC. 11. The Board of Trustees shall have power to assess and collect special taxes on real property to build and repair sidewalks and to improve streets on which said property abuts. Provided such tax shall not be assessed when a majority of the frontage on the proposed improvement shall remonstrate against the same.  
SEC. 12. The Board of Trustees shall have power to lay out, establish, widen, extend and open streets or parts of streets within the corporate limits of the Town, being provided by Ordinance for the manner in which the same shall be done.  
SEC. 13. Inasmuch as there is an urgent necessity for the building of sidewalks between the commencement of winter this act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the Governor.
