Local News. The Harvest.

The showers of this week stopped work in the harvest field, to the detriment of farmers. There is some wheat and a great deal of the oat crop unthreshed. If this weather should hold through the present week a good deal of grain will be damaged. T. G. Todd, the Gleason brothers, Mr. Alexander and several farmers on the south side of Gale's creek, on the Tualatin river, and Wapato lake have large fields of wheat standing out, some of it not cut and some in the shock. The rain Sunday night was light and some began to thresh again Monday evening, but rain came again Monday and Tuesday nights with cloudy weather during the day time and now it would take a day or two of sunshine before work could begin, Mr. Alexander who lives some two miles southwest of the Grove has all of his spring crop in the shock yet. Mr. Todd wanted to thresh it last Sunday but Mr. Alexander desired to wait and we fear now that he will suffer damage. Most all of the wheat crop is threshed however and the loss if any will be mostly confined to late







