Oregon Wagon Road Grants.

WASHINGTON, March 30. - Barclay Henley is expected here in a few days to argue the case of the wagon road grants in Oregon before the house committee on public lands.

Mr. Henley was formerly a member of that committee. One wagon road grant in Oregon is owned by a number of San Francisco capitalists, who, it is said, paid \$400,000 for the grant.

Cleveland's message recommending immediate forfeiture of these grants is regarded as one of the most preposterous propositions he has submitted to congress. It is stated that much of the land granted to the wagon roads has been patented and sold to settlers, and the president recommends that these grants be forfeited without giving the purchasers of this land a hearing in the courts. The president's statement was glancingly in part. The evidence submitted to congress was collected by irresponsible agents, and many owners of land granted to these wagon roads were not afforded an opportunity to offer testimony as to the extent of their right to the lands.
