From Oskaloosa.

The latest report from Oskaloosa, Kansas, which burg has a woman for mayor and a council composed of women, is as follows:

It is reported that the committee which was appointed to draft a new set of ordinances for Oskaloosa is progressing very rapidly with its work, but so far the rules of procedure and the morals of the men are the only points touched upon. The first measure that will be presented for consideration, and the one that will receive the unanimous vote of the council, will be one establishing the "Mother Hubbard" as the official dress of the mayor and council when in session. Declaring all men who appear on the street unshaved and unwashed to be vagrants and ordering their arrest and fine.

As the quiet and decorum of the council must be maintained at all hazards, the selection of a marshal will depend on the aptness of the applicant in caring for the babies, who will be kept in an ante-room while their mothers attend to the affairs of state.

Built for War. Wm. Crump & Sons, ship and engine builders at Philadelphia, have nearly completed a dynamite cruiser gunboat called the Yorktown, designed for the U. S. navy. It will be launched on Saturday, April 28, in the presence of Secretary Whitney. It carries four pneumatic guns for the purpose of hurling dynamite projectiles, each with a range of at least a mile. The trailing of the guns is accomplished by steering the vessel, and the loading is all done by steam. The guns are of 15-inch calibre, and the shells, which can be fired with great accuracy twice a minute, will contain 600 pounds of explosive gelatine, equivalent to 852 pounds of gun-cotton, or 216 pounds of gun-cotton. It is claimed that the gun, properly handled, will be the most destructive engine of war yet invented, for the heaviest armored vessels in the world will go all to pieces from the explosion of a shell much smaller than those thrown by the guns of the Yorktown.

The Law Concerning Strikes. Judge Love, of the United States district court in Iowa, thus explains the law governing strikes:

1. Railroad employees have a right to quit work. 2. But they have no right to prevent others from taking their places, nor to interfere with the operation of the road. 3. A railroad company must haul the freight of every other company on equal terms. 4. It is no excuse for the company to say that its employees will handle the cars of a road on which there is a strike. 5. Such company must obey the laws of the land, not the order of the Brotherhood of Engineers. 6. If it refuses the traffic of another road it may be ordered to carry by the courts, and, moreover, is liable to suits for damages at the hands of shippers.

Virtue in Onions and Beef. Kansas City Star: What is the most strengthening food for a convalescent? Well, you know, the beef-tea theory has been exploded. The most life-giving and digestible food that can be given to one just recovering from an illness is chopped beef. Just take a pound of the finest round of raw beef, cut off all the fat, slice two onions, and add pepper and salt. A Political Scheme. PRESBURG, April 23.—The Chronicle-Telegraph to-day claims to have information of a bold scheme to control the republican presidential nomination.

The plan is to stampede the convention for Blaine, with the expectation that if he refuse the nomination his declination can not be received until after the adjournment of the convention. In this event the national committee will be called upon to name the man.
