San Francisco, June 21 .- The

steamer Bertha, which has arrived of the sailors of the codfishing schooner Isabel. The Isabel encountered a gale May 1, and on the 3d had to be abandoned. The men took to the boats, but in the storm got separated. The eight skiffs which contained the pineteen men on board the Isabel, at first divided being lashed together. After being out three days two of the men went mad from the hardships endured and had to be put in a separate boat, and soon were drowned. When another boat capsized, Capt. Nickerson, in trying to save the lives of the men therein, was drowned, as were also the men whom he tried to rescue.
