"Westward Ho!" exclaims the Buffalo Commercial Advertiser, and then it says: "The generally unsatisfactory condition of mercantile affairs, and the cloud of uncertainty which has hung, and still hangs, over the business future, has caused many to relinquish their business connections in the older States of the East, and to seek new fields for enterprise.
