Sulphur in the West Indies.

The New York Standard, a new and lively daily paper under the charge of John Russell Young, publishes the following important paragraph:

Sulphur is a substance which has, if not a fragrant, at least a decided odor, and is useful both internally and externally. Besides these purely personal uses, it is largely used in this country in the manufacture of sulphuric acid. and for other manufacturing purposes. As a matter of course, the source of supply becomes a matter of consequence especially to proprietors of extensive manufacturing works. Heretofore, the regret at learning that one of the popprincipal source of supply has been from the extensive deposits left by the volcanic movements observed there. We are glad, however, to know, and to be the first to announce, that a source of supply has been discovered much nearer home.
