Telegraphic Summary.

LONDON, Jan. 7.—Semi-official authority announces that it is impossible to fix the time of a meeting of a Congress of powers, in consequence of the absence of the French representatives. The Observer says the Conference of powers will certainly meet before the 23rd of January. The refusal of Favre to attend is not considered final, but whether France is represented or not, the Conference will assemble.

BORDEAUX, Jan. 9.—Details of Friday's fighting near Vendome received. At 11 o'clock in the morning the Germans attacked Gen. Custin Criville, at Parochville Thauve. The French were driven back to Neuville. The French commander then brought up his supporters, recapturing all his positions and repulsing the Prussians beyond Sainte Romaine, which the French re-entered at night. The German loss was considerable; that of the French trifling.

LONDON, Jan. 10.—A dispatch from Lille says the Germans are massing south of Bapaume. French sharpshooters near Lille successfully engaged the Uhlans to-day, taking 43 prisoners.

The Prussians have raised the siege of Langres.

London, Jan. 8.—Telegrams from Versailles to the Times to-day say the American Consul has been permitted to leave Paris, and has arrived here.

The Germans captured and sent to Isle of Olron many Bonapartists agents, who have been arrested.

London, Jan. 9.—A correspondent says Morgency says the Forts Rosney and Nugent suffered severely, and that it is believed there are no French infantry outside the fortifications on the east and north-east. Paris is active, and offensive preparations are expected immediately.

Berlin, Jan. 9.—The King telegraphs the Queen from Versailles on the 8th; Frederick Charles continues his victorious advance on Lemens. Everything has been quiet in the north since the 3d inst. The bombardment is proceeding favorably. The barracks in the fortifications are on fire.

State Items.

We are informed by the Bed Rock Democrat that the stage brokethrough the ice on the Payette, two horses were drowned, and the mails much injured.

The editor of the Bedrock threatens an extra flow of "brains" if the mails do not furnish them daily exchanges soon.

The Eugene City Journal states, the stage of water in the Willamette to be such, that boats may run there, and their are liable to be "hooted at" any moment.

A united prayer meeting was held each evening during the last week, at Eugene.

The West Side says, a young man living near string town, was injured by the explosion of a gun on the 31st ult.

The Bulletin states that the city of Portland is to have a fine public park; the city council having appropriated \$32,000 for the purchase of land, to be used for that purpose.

S Alcorn doing business in Portland was arrested on a charge of forgery, and acquitted.

The Oneonta resumed her place in the Dalles trade on the 2d inst.

The Albany Register gives the particulars of a painful accident. Mrs. D. Beach fell on the sidewalk and broke her right hip.

The question of building an Odd Fellows Temple is under advisement by the people of Albany.
