CINCINNATI BALTIMORE P AT-FORM.

1. We recognize the equality of all men before the law, and hold that it is the duty of the government in its dealings with the people to mete out equal and exact justice to all, of whatever nationality, race, color or persuasion, religous or political.

2. We pledge ourselves to maintain the union of the States, emancipation and enfranchisement, and to oppose any reopening of the questions settled by the 13 th, 14th and 15th amendments.

3. We demand the immediate and absolute removal of all disabilities imposed on account of the rebellion wihich was fully subdued seven years ago, believing that universal amnesty will result in a complete pacification of all sections of the country.

4. Local self-government with impartial suffrage will guard the rights of all citizens more securely than any centralized power. The public welfare BOLTER & WORTLY, requires this supremacy of the civil over the military power, and freedom of person under the protection of the habeas corpus. We demand for individuals the largest liberties consistent with public order; for States, self government, and for the nation, a return to the methods of peace and the constitutional limitation of power.

5 The civil service of the Govornment has become a mere instrument of partisan tyranny, and personal ambition, and an object of selfishness. It is a scandal and a reproach upon free stitutions, and breathes a demoralization dangerous to the perpetuity of a Republican Government. We therefore regard a thorough reform of the civil service as one of the most pressing necessities of the hour; that honesty capacity and fidelity constitute the only valid ciaim to public employment ; that the offices of the government cease to be a matter of arbitrary favoritism and patronage and that a public station may again become a post of honor, and it is imperatively required that no President shall be a candidate for reelection.

6. We demand a system of federal taxation which shall not unnecessarily interfere with the industries of the people, and which shall provide the means necessary to pay the expenses of the government economically administered, pensions, the interest on the public debt and a moderate reduction He feels confident that he will give entire sat annually of the principle thereof. And recognizing that there are in our midst honest but irreconcilable difference of opinion with regard to the respective systems of protection and free trade, we remit the discussion of the subject to the people in their Congressional Districts and to the decision of Congress thereon, wholly free from Executive control or dictation.

7. The public credit must be sacredly maintained, and we denounce repudiation in every form.

8. A speedy return to specie pay ments is demanded alike by the highest consideration of commercial morality and honest government.

9. We remember with gratitude the heroism and sacrifices of the soldiers and sailors of the Republic, and no act of ours shall ever detract from their justly-earned fame, or the full records of their patriotism.

11. We hold that it is the duty of the Government in its intercourse with foreign nations to cultivate their friendship by treating them on fair and equal to demand what is not right or to submit to what is wrong.

12. For the promotion and success of these vital principles and the support of the candidates nominated by this Convention, we invite and cordially welcome the co-operation of all patriotic citizen, without regard to previous poitical affiliations.

Greeley as Congressman

The Springfield Republican says: It is possible, as some of our friends insist, that Mr. Greeley will make a poor President. But it is unwise in them to insist that he was a failure as a Congressman. On the question of opinion they may be right; on the question of fact we know them to be wrong. Mr. Greeley's whole term of service in the House barely covered a period of three months. Yet in the quarter of a year he set on foot three great reforms of which the country is now reaping the benefit. It was Congressman Greeley who brought in the first homestead bill, who struck the first blow at the mileage abuse, and who first assailed the English doctrine, 'Once a subject, always a subject,' by laying down in a resolution the doctrine that every man has a right to migrate from his native land to another, and, in becoming a citizen of the latter, to renounce alleg suce to the former. Not a very bad record for three months."

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
