

REQUEL TO A KANSAS TRAGEDY.

New York, October 8.—Six years ago J. S. Hoke, who was then a wealthy and prosperous lumber merchant in Atchison, Kansas, married a Miss Leland, who resided in the same town. For five years they lived happily together, and during that time a child was born. A man named W. W. Marbourg, who had been his schoolmate in youth and the close companion of his early manhood's years had been a constant and welcome visitor in the house. In all those years, believing implicitly in the love of his wife and honor of his friend, he never expected anything wrong until January last, when circumstances convinced him that there was a criminal intimacy existing between Marbourg and his wife. As soon as he became satisfied of this, he armed himself, and meeting Marbourg in the street, shot him down. A short time previous to this his wife left on a visit to the East, taking with her their child. Hoke was indicted for the attempted murder, and allowed to go at large on bail. He waited some time for the return of his wife, and then began one of the most extraordinary searches for a child on record. When his wife left she told him she was going to Angola, in the State of New York, and there after, providing himself with sufficient funds, he made his first visit. Here his worst suspicions were confirmed, for he found that she had not been there at all. Going back to Atchison, he commenced the search. For over six months, through every State in the Union and all over Canada, he sought his lost and loved child. Here and there he found traces of his wife, who was accompanied by her mother and the child, and who took every possible means to disguise themselves so that he would not be able to track them. In his journeying to Canada, he found that his wife and Marbourg had been there. He could find no further trace. Worn and dispirited with the terrible search, in which he had traveled over 18,000 miles, he arrived in Brooklyn. As he had done in every other place, he spent his time traveling through the streets, eagerly scanning the face of her child that looked like his lost darling. In hopeless search yesterday afternoon he happened to pass down Willoughby street. He had a habit of looking at the windows of all the houses as he passed. As he passed the house of number 123 Willoughby street, he almost fainted at beholding his child at the window in the rooms of Mrs. E. C. Leland, his mother-in-law. Smothering his impatience, he hurried to the Sheriff's office and made a sworn complaint, and obtaining the assistance of a deputy Sheriff and a special badge for himself, he went to the house where he had seen the child. It was in the arms of his mother-in-law, who made a desperate resistance but of course they succeeded in getting possession. This morning, through his counsel, Mr. Hoke made a motion before Judge Gilbert for the possession of the child, and the story related above came out. The hearing was set down for to-morrow, the custody of the child, in the mean time, being awarded to the Sheriff. Mr. Hoke has not seen his wife since she left him, and he says, knowing that she loves another man better than she loves him, does not want to see her; but he will have his child at the cost of his life, if necessary.
