Among others we notice Williams, Bronough, Strong and need of Portland; Boise and Lawson of Salem ; Kelsey and Burnett, of Corvallis; Ramsey, Latayette: and Humphrey of Albany. The Court adjourned an Wednesday over till Monday. Up to its adjournment, the Grand Jury had found no indictment against Glaze.

Scovill the assailant was indicted by the Grand Jury for assault with a dangerous weapon and in default of \$1000 bail, fixed by Judge Bonham is in jail waiting his trial which comes off on Monday next.

HIPPLE MITCHEL .- There has been a good deal of talk about Hipple alias Mitchell, but the lawyers in Court this week took a practical view of the case. In the case of Scovill vs Barney, which has been in Court for the las, two years, Mitchell acted as one of Scovill's attorneys, and Scovill had given Mitchell a mortgage on the place in dispute to secure his fee and eighteen hundred dollars which was loaned to Scovill to enable him to prosecute the suit, Mitchell brought suit at this term of Court to foreclose the mortgage. 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
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
