Hood River, Wasco Co. Oregon. January 31, 1886.

To the Editor of the Columbian.

Sir Here in Hood River we have been under siege for a week in the snow. Up to the 19th of this month we had only occasionally this year seen the color of snow. The stock has all been wandering out as late as the above named date. As the winter was so far advanced there was a look of half expectancy that we would escape entirely those huge masses of snow which have frequently visited these regions in bygone winters. But it was no go. After several days of rain and sleet with smaller frosts between times, snow commenced falling the 19th, and after a four days' storm there was more than three feet of snow on a level. A week ago today the snow was piled up with one day's rain on top of it. The cold that had been severe during the snow-storm had by that time slackened down, the atmosphere took a milder character, the wind changed from the West, and the rain-storm recommenced again. The sun has been scarcely visible these past two weeks. Today the rain has been pouring down all the time just as it usually does at this season in the swamps of Mississippi. The snow is rapidly settling and melting away and is less than a foot deep. Should there come, as the probability is, a few days, Chinook wind and the snow would speedily say Good-bye. Some of my neighbors are impatiently longing for it so that they could again proceed with their out-door work just as if there were not time and opportunity to do all the out-door work in 11 months out of twelve. So far as I have heard, there has been no block-ade nor accident on the railroad about the Cascades during this snow-storm neither has there been any stock lost among the settlers as they have been careful and well prepared, taking warning from previous years.

The people in Hood River keep their spirits up in order for merry-making and sociality. There have been several dances this winter. Two weeks ago there was a masquerade ball in town. Last Friday there was a ball in the settlement by Mr. Wren's.
