ate the various failroad companies securing new franchises and right-of-ways, etc. In order to give an idea of the immense amount of lumber that the forests of Oregon contain, it is only necessary to quote the following from the Brownsville Times: H. G. McKinley, accompanied

by three other timbermen, went into the timber belt a few miles east of this city this week, and in township 15 south, range 2 east, he measured off one acre and counted the fir trees thereon. On this one acre were 81 trees which will average 100 feet in longth aud 31/2 in diameter, making about 400,000 feet. This is all fir and hence does not include a large amount of hemlock. Mr. McKinley says this timber has fallen into good hands, and soon-less than five years-big mills will begin the manufacture of lumber and then Brownsville will take on new life.


