A gas company which negligently permits its supply of natural gas for light and fuel to flow with such pressure that a building is set on fire on account of it is held, in Barrickman vs. Marion Oil Company (W. Va.), 44 L. R. A. 92, to be liable for damages.

Personal assets of a national bank are held in people vs. National Bank of D. River, Wyoming. O. Mills & Co. (Cal.), 45 L. R. A. 747. to be beyond the authority of a State to tax, under U. S. Rev. 

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
