One of the most prominent features of the constitution Article V to the effect that "no liability at any time shall be incurred by the association greater than the available funds on hand."

In the matter of petition for road in the Oliver Creek country, Fred Buchanan, Jesse Brown and J W Foster were appointed viewers, and County Surveyor Waggoner was instructed to survey and plat the same and make a written report in the matter at the next session of the county court.

In the matter of road across lands of J J Waggoner, Johnson Porter, G Harding and E J Elliott were appointed viewers to mark out and locate said road and assess the damages to be sustained by any person in the establishment of said road. The were instructed to report at the next term of court.

In the proposed change of road leading from Independent school house to Philomath-Alsea road, Wm Crees, J E Wyatt and Caleb Davis, Sr, were appointed viewers, with Surveyor Waggoner to investigate at the next session of court.

In the matter of rockcrusher the firm of Austin & Weston Co. L't'd, represented by W L Mercer, who was brought here by J H Simpson, were awarded the crusher at \$1,154. There were extra jaws ordered for the same that will cost in the neighborhood of \$50.

The petition for a free ferry across the Willamette river at Corvallis was denied. It was ordered that M P Burnett file his bond as sheriff and tax collector of Benton county in the sum of \$20,000 as per law required.

An exchange furnishes the following hints on poultry raising that are certain to prove beneficial to all who will follow its lead:

Success and failure with poultry depend upon the poultryman himself. There are good opportunities with poultry and many ways of making a certain amount of money by judicious arrangements and close attention in the keeping of fowls; but for a beginner to suppose that because he is provided with a certain amount of money, and can secure a likely place for business, success is just as a mistake. Although just at first matters may seem easy, the undertaking may sooner or later end in a very sad awakening to the reality of dead loss. But provided the business could be made an adjunct to something else which does pay, then, with acquired knowledge—gotten only by experience—and unremitting attention to even the smallest details, it may be made to add very materially to the annual receipts, and later on may be made an exclusive business.
