

Extra Session Talk.

There is some talk of an extra session of the Oregon Legislature in hope that the state may appropriate \$1,000,000 toward the Lewis & Clark Exposition to be held in Portland in 1905.

Members of the Legislature, residing in this city, and in fact all members of the Oregon Legislature, have received a copy of a circular letter, from Edward Everett Young, of Baker City, editor of the Republican of that city, and one of the Oregon Commissioners for the Lewis & Clark Exposition.
