

COURAGE AND TACT.

That both the operators and the miners should consent to submit their differences to a commission appointed by President Roosevelt is the strongest possible evidence of the unbounded confidence the people have in his courage, integrity and patriotism. Not since the days of Lincoln have the American people had a president in whom the common masses so thoroughly believe and to whom they so heedfully listen.

We cannot go so far as some portions of the press in laudation of the president and of Mitchell, the president of the Miners' Union. The president has but done a patriotic duty. He is the first president to attempt the solution of labor difficulties by peaceful reasoning and reasonable methods. His immense popularity and the peculiar conditions of the strife made it possible for him to lay hold of the difficulties and impel them toward a just and speedy settlement. It required courage and tact to do this. He possesses these, just as the people believed.

As to Mr. Mitchell, he is entitled to small credit for the adjudication of the trouble. That the strike was ordered to take place during an election year, and that it has been prolonged until the consumers of coal have felt the discomforts of its lack are old and frequently practiced tactics of labor leaders. Large numbers of the strikers had passed beyond his control and were engaged in mob violence, attended with destruction of life and property. The military power of the state had to be called upon to restore order. When this was done the only thing the Miners' Union could do was to see work resumed without it or accept arbitration. This was the juncture of affairs the president tactfully improved.

It is a mistake to claim that organized labor has gained a victory through the action of the president. Not one question at issue between the operators and the miners has been passed upon. This is the function of the commission. The operators, who had already declared their willingness to submit to the decision of an unbiased and impartial body of arbitrators, and had, indeed, suggested one, do not feel that the acceptance of the president's commission is any sort of victory over them.

So far, it is but a reasonable victory of the public over the hurtful, selfish, cold-blooded conduct of those engaged in supplying a public necessity. In the abstract, the difference between the operators and their employes are of little moment. The public has its own grievances against the great coal corporations, and by far more important than any the Miners' Union can have. It is not probable the commission just appointed will consider any of these. The great state of Pennsylvania did not amend her constitution until these coal-owning, coal-carrying corporations were in full legal possession of their franchises and properties. It was a case of locking the stable door after the horse was stolen. Yet they must be, finally will be, controlled. Meanwhile, let there be no boasting of victory of either party over the other.

Schools Visited.

Supt. Denman, who has been busily engaged for the last few weeks visiting the schools of our county, has kindly consented to give us a few notes on his observations in his school visitations. While the law only requires the County School Superintendent to visit the schools of the county once a year, it is the rule of Supt. Denman to visit as far as possible the schools in the county twice a year. This increases the interest of the pupils and patrons alike. There are in Benton county 57 school districts which require considerable time and traveling to do the work that has been done by Supt. Denman. The schools visited and a few observations are as follows: District No. 43 was visited Oct. 8th. Number of pupils present 25; number enrolled 30; length of visit, two hours and forty-five minutes; those neither absent nor tardy since beginning of school: Minnie, Myrtle, Golda, Lena and Virgil Peacock, Clinton Wyatt, Hayden Risley, Worth Pugh, Maud Hughes, Myrtle Wyatt, Addie Pugh, Mary Hember, Bennie Hember, Willie Hember, Joseph Avers, Walter Spindall, Horace Martin. During the past year a neat fence has been placed around the school grounds. Mr. T. J. Risley is teaching the present term.

District No. 45 was visited October 5. Number pupils enrolled 5; number pupils present 5; teacher, Inez St. German. Directors, Oliver Witham, Stephen

Grigg, Lafa Stewart; Clerk, Joe Bryant. During the summer the directors have had the house painted inside and out. New seats have been purchased. By a little work on the grounds much would be added to the new improvements.

District No. 8 was visited October 9th. Number of pupils enrolled 20; number present 10; directors are A. Bicknell, A. T. Wilson, George Linderman; clerk, C. E. Moore; teacher, Crystal Miner. The school house has been supplied with new seats. A new coat of paint has been given the house recently. The school grounds have a number of fine shade trees which add to the comfort of pupils and locks of the property.

District No. 13 was visited October 13. Mary Jones, an O. A. O. graduate, is employed as teacher; board consists of clerk, E. J. Newton; directors, George Cooper, J. E. Wyatt, J. A. Park; pupils enrolled 14. The house and grounds are in good repair. The house is furnished with good seats. The addition of a case of maps and black board would be of a great assistance to the teacher and benefit to the pupils.

District No. 16 was visited October 13. Directors, J. R. Hulbert, J. D. Howell, John Goose; Clerk, Henry Gerhard. Much can be added to the comfort of the pupils if a few needed improvements could be made. Prof. J. D. Wood, the oldest teacher in Benton county, and perhaps in Oregon, is employed. Prof. Wood is now teaching on his 15th term. Forty four years ago he taught in the same settlement. He has taught for nearly 48 years in eleven counties in Oregon. During this entire time he has never laid off a year and has never adjourned his school a day for sickness.
