

NO CRUDE LEGISLATION.

Those who expect congress to apply hammer and tongs legislation in tariff revision, and the regulation of trusts, are destined to disappointment. There will be no such legislation at any time, and certainly not at the next, or short session of congress.

Regulation of trusts will be undertaken in the same spirit. There will be nothing found in the president's message that will unsettle industrial conditions or disturb any business interest. Whatever recommendations the president may make, we may be sure none will be of a disturbing character.

The managers of the great trusts and corporations now see the wisdom of republican purposes as set out by the president and admit that his policy contemplates only the removal of such evils as cannot be defended and should not be endured.

DEAD DUCKS.

The antis long persisted in declaring that we should give the Filipinos the same degree of self government that we gave the Porto Ricans, in spite of the fact that the latter were by far better prepared for self government.

Of two parties in Porto Rico, one is opposed to American rule; the other is not so much opposed, but both parties oppose American influence and seek to give power and authority to native municipal rulers.

Trade with the United States is free. Duties collected from importations from other countries go into the treasury of the island. The island practically pays nothing into the national treasury.

We have improved their harbors, built them good roads, established and improved their schools, analyzed their soils, examined their forests and done a multitude of things to encourage and improve the people.

Having virtually suppressed the Philippine insurrection we are about to give the inhabitants just such opportunities for development and self government as

we are giving the Porto Ricans. Our Senator Mitchell will introduce a bill giving them free trade with us. This is laudible and really to the Pacific Coast people will be advantageous.

Most beneficent, indeed, has our government been to the people of our insular possessions, infinitely better than any they could possibly conduct for themselves.
