

THE SENATE HAGGLES.

The magnitude of the evils, actual and imminent, of unrestrained immigration of this character is, indeed, alarming, especially when we remember that under our mischievously liberal naturalization laws these creatures soon acquire the privilege of voting.

Legislation has been undertaken to render our immigration laws more stringent. The house has passed a very good bill to regulate and restrict immigration. It prescribes an educational test by requiring immigrants above a certain age to be able to read 25 words of some part of the constitution printed in small type and in his own language.

The senate will not improve much, it at all, on the house bill, and surely would save time and better serve the country by passing the house bill and sending it to the president.

LESSONS IN GERMAN.

In Germany, The Commercial Treaties Association which represent 5,000,000 persons has memorialized the government asking for commercial treaties with foreign countries and that meddling with the tariff cease.

These are just the conditions which would affect the business of this country were congress to attempt a general revision of our

tariff laws. Germany appears to need stability of economic policy, just now very much, for she faces a deficit for the year of \$37,500,000.
