

AT KIEL.

The reception which the German government and people gave to our little squadron of war vessels commanded by Admiral Cotten is pleasing evidence that Germany will need to have a very grave cause for it before she engages in war with us.

We are of the same racial stirps as the Germans and actuated by ideals and purposes as high, as noble as any entertained by them.

Kiel is the most important harbor of Germany. Its approach, as well as the city itself, are very strongly fortified.

These scenes of royal welcome will be repeated at Portsmouth, England. Our vessels will anchor in the inner harbor, a privilege never before granted the war vessels of any people.

The world will be benefited by these international courtesies. Of themselves they are of secondary importance, but they seem to be part of a divine scheme for cementing these three peoples into closer relations and into more perfect unity of purpose to advance the cause of human right and righteousness.

Hammond Says, Extend C. & E.

A. B. Hammond, in a Portland interview said: "The way for Portland to get a railroad into interior Oregon is to go ahead and extend the Corvallis & Eastern. If you do that you will have to wait for Harriman's veriform appendix to get well. Your citizens are pursuing a mistaken policy. They cannot expect that Harriman will put his money in here and allow you to sandbag him when he's done. Nor would I put in money and be sandbagged, either. You people make a mistake if you think he is going to permit you to holdup the country through him.

See here: I will make traffic arrangements with any company that will connect with the Corvallis & Eastern. Or, I will sell the road. It has the easiest grade of any route into Eastern Oregon. It will reach that country by a two per cent grade. The Columbia Southern route cannot be compared with the Santiam at all. Ask the engineers; they know. Ask Kennedy of the O. R. & N.; he knows. The Corvallis & Eastern has 143 miles of track. By means of spurs it will open to Portland great areas of new country. You Portland people can use it to get into the Siletz country, besides running over the Cascades into Eastern Oregon.

"Why extend the Columbia Southern? It has already reached the limit of its productive country. It does very well as a spur or feeder, but as a road for getting into the interior it is the poorest of any."

Casterline has a Rival.

Every inventor of some useful device, or discoverer of scientific secrets of value to the human race, has to face a pretender who claims to have prior rights. Edisons, Roetgens, Marconi, and all

the others have had this experience. Now B. J. Casterline is confronted by one Zachariah Taylor Clark, a resident of Portland, who claims to have the exclusive right to employ a chemical process for the hardening of iron and steel.

The Clark-Neill process is known as the Electro Tempering and Toughening Compound, and Mr. Clark, who has purchased the rights of his former partner, Neill, declares that if Casterline does not at once cease infringement upon his rights he will carry the matter into the courts.

"I do not accuse Mr. Casterline of willfully appropriating my discovery to his own ends," Z. T. Clark said last Tuesday, "but I hereby warn him that he must accord to me my rights. I worked for 20 years to perfect the steel-hardening process and I do not propose to have the work of a lifetime go for nothing.

"I am at present in communication with a firm that is to put my invention on the market, and within a reasonable time expect to realize an independent fortune. I worked hard at the discovery and have scraped and scimped and almost starved since it was perfected in the effort to bring about its acceptance by some company with a sufficient amount of capital to cause it to bring returns. Mr. Casterline must cease his use of my invention."

Mr. Clark says that once in the past he had an experience similar to what he terms "the Casterline affair." H. B. Depoy, an Indiana man, announced his discovery of a steel-hardening process and sought to obtain a patent upon the same. Clark appeared and contested his claim and Depoy was compelled to retire defeated from the field.

Shooting Contest Tomorrow.

The program for the day will be as follows:

- Event No. 1—6 targets, known angles, entrance 25 cents.
No. 2—10 targets, known angles, entrance 50 cents.
No. 3—10 targets, unknown angles, entrance 50 cents.
No. 4—10 targets, reserved pull, entrance 50 cents.
No. 5—10 targets, unknown angles, entrance 50 cents.
No. 6—5 pair doubles, known angles, entrance 50 cents.
No. 7—Three-man team shoot, 15 targets per man, unknown angles. Any three shooters to constitute a team; entrance \$3 per team. Purse divided 60 and 40 per cent.
No. 8—10 targets, unknown angles, entrance 50 cents.
No. 9—10 targets, reserved pull, entrance 50 cents.
No. 10—20 targets, unknown angles, entrance \$1.

Shooting will begin promptly at 10 a. m. Traps will be open for practice at 9 a. m.

All shooting will be class shooting; purses, except team shoot, divided 50, 30 and 20 per cent and contests will be governed by the American Association rules.

Targets will be thrown at 2 1/2 cents each, to be deducted from the purse in each event. One set of expert traps, electric pull, will be used and the shooting will be under the rapid-fire system.

SPECIAL PRIZES.

The club offers a cash prize of \$5 to the contestant making the best average in the day's shooting. Emery, photographer, offers one dozen platinum photos, value \$5, for the second best average.

R. M. Wade & Co. offer one nickle triple multiplying reel, value \$3.50, for the third best average.

J. R. Smith & Co. offer 50 smokeless shells, value \$1.50, for the shooter making the lowest average.

(To be eligible for these average prizes the contestant must shoot through at least eight out of the ten events.)

Huston & Bogue offer 50 smokeless shells, value \$1.50, for the best individual score in the team shoot.
