Big Circus Parade.

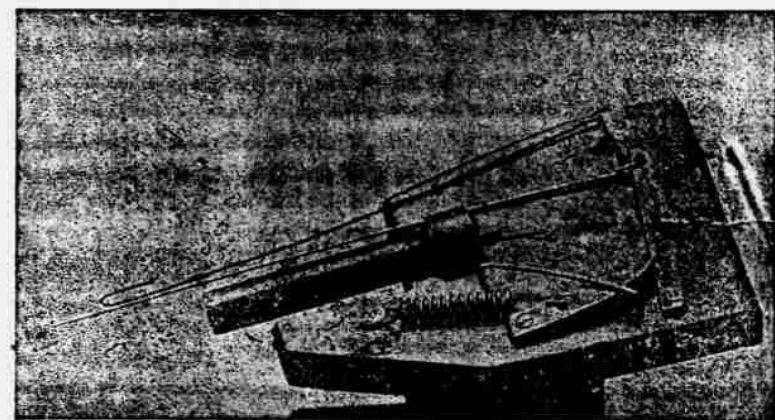
