Editorial Comment.

The present campaign of the Democracy has developed into one of apology only. The trust brand is not acceptable to the rank and file of the honest men in the party. Every day records open revolt of some man who has been prominent in Democratic ranks in the past. The thing is natural; it is inevitable, and it is creditable to the men themselves.

There never was such an open and palpable game attempted on the American people; and every hand in it has been exposed.

Wall street, and the gold brick sellers who have been floating trusts, having succeeded in obtaining the control of affairs, and placing their candidate on the ticket by successful strategy, are determined to push the thing through regardless of the feelings of the voters of the party.

The old dominating spirit of ante-bellum days is once more in the saddle, and the old slogan is again the watchword, "What right have you got to think? all we want is your vote!"

The Democratic convention at St. Louis was controlled by the interests which the Democratic party has been professing for years to fight; its nominee was selected by men who have been denounced by every Democratic orator in a decade; and it was done for the sole purpose of trying to defeat President Roosevelt for his work in opposing trusts, against which the Democrats have professed to feel such bitter hostility.

For a sincere Democrat to support Parker as against Roosevelt requires an abandonment of principle on the altar of partisanship, or a practical admission that his professed hostility to the unlawful combinations of capital was a matter of false pretense.

But it is doubtful if this policy of the present leaders will prevail. The slave-driver's whip has cracked for the last time in this country, and we have a better opinion of the honesty of the rank and file of the party, than to believe that they will allow themselves to be buncoed in this matter.

Preparing To Build.

Material is being hauled on the grounds for the erection of two large wings to the main building of Philomath College. Actual work will probably not be begun before early fall, but matters are taking shape and all things are being done so that when the work actually begins it will be done in a very short time.

The main building when completed will be three stories high and 104 feet long and 60 feet wide. This will give ample room for present needs so far as needed class rooms are concerned. The two wings one on the east and the other on the west side will be each three stories high, 60 feet long and 32 feet wide. The tower will be worked over and the whole covered with a mansard roof.

J. R. Parker, the efficient manager has already secured \$4000 with which to commence the work and is going East to secure funds with which to erect a boy's dormitory. The Board of directors is also planning to erect several neat little cottages to rent, the funds therefor accruing as interest from permanent College funds. Philomath College is very prosperous financially and have no debt and owns considerable Philomath property.

President Caldwell Marries.

Erwin E. Caldwell, the newly elected President of Philomath college, was married Saturday in York, Nebraska to Lena E. Schell, the second daughter of President Schell of York College, where the bride and groom graduated in 1902. The father of the bride officiated.

The bride has also received an appointment to fill a chair in Philomath College. They will be at home at Philomath after September 1, after a brief visit to friends in Nebraska.
