**FINDS SHORTAGE.**

Those who have been working on the books of E. P. Greffoz find him short in the sum of \$1,875.72. The committee appointed have been at work four or five nights and have not completed their labors and it is thought that the amount of the shortage will approximate \$2,000. The shortage is found in the various items of sewer money. Five sewers are not recorded on his books at all, either paid or unpaid, and it is not possible at the present time to tell how much has been paid on these five sewers. It is thought, however, that all, or nearly all, has been paid, and that the people hold Mr. Greffoz's receipt for the money.

The books are in an awful muddle and the wonder is that some errors were not detected heretofore, as every year the finance committee is supposed to have examined the books. At any rate each year the books have been marked "OK."

It appears that somebody is going to be the loser on this proposition in the sum of about \$2,000. Who will stand the loss? Will an attempt be made to have the parties through whose property the sewers pass pay twice? or will the city stand the loss? At present, in the face of our financial condition the city is in no position to assume this indebtedness, nor is it just to expect property owners to pay twice for the installation of their sewers. It is likely that a special meeting of the council will soon be called to deliberate on what is best to do.

**Eureka Cadets.**

The Eureka (Calif.) cadets arrived in this city Wednesday afternoon, having marched from Harrisburg that day. They are enroute to the Exposition at Portland, where they expect to spend a week.

There are about 60 boys and some seven or eight men in the corps. They left Eureka, June 12 and were just exactly one month reaching this city. The distance from Eureka to Portland on the route they are traveling is 570 miles. They expect to make Portland next Thursday. From here they go to Albany today and thence down the East Side to the metropolis.

After their stay there, they go back to Humboldt bay by boat. The boys range from six years of age on up to manhood. They will have marched the entire distance from Eureka to Portland. Since leaving their homes, they have suffered but little indisposition. When they first started on their journey, some of them were bothered for a time with sore feet, but at present they are all sound and well and show plainly that camp life agrees with them. While here they were encamped on the vacant lot just back of the laundry.

Last evening they were to give an entertainment in the Opera House and the indications were that they would have a good house. They are a splendidly behaved lot of boys and are a credit to the city from whence they came. This will be an outing that they will all remember to the last day of their lives.

**Case Came Up.**

The case of Jacob Blumberg, charged with selling liquor in violation of the law, came up for a hearing, Monday. The case was brought by Deputy Prosecuting Attorney E. R. Bryson, and was tried in Justice Hoggate's court. Mr. Blumberg was defended by W. R. Bilyeu, of Albany. Both attorneys are credited with handling their cases well.

Quite a number of witnesses were called and their testimony taken. The defendant had demanded a trial by jury and the purpose of this body was as follows: John Bier, John Stewart, J. B. Goodman, Philip Phile, E. W. Strong and Emer: Allen. After the jury retired they took three ballots and the third resulted in a verdict of guilty. Judge Hoggate imposed a fine of \$50 and costs. Mr. Blumberg's attorney asked for a stay or proceedings on the ground that in all likelihood an appeal would be taken. So the matter rests.
