NEW YEAR SUGGESTIONS.

Benjamin Franklin was the most profound teacher and the most notable editor that the world has ever known. His teachings promulgated through his newspaper the "Philadelphia Gazette" and his almanac full of truthful economic sayings for twenty-five years had more to do with moulding the conditions and forming the opinions of the people in those early days in this country, than any other influence.

His honesty of purpose and utmost endeavor to impress the most truth and the best ideas upon the people of his time has never been questioned by any one. He scorned the practices of dissembling. His utterances were always of a positive nature in simple language which could easily be understood by every one. He started out alone at the age of 17 years as a journeyman printer and in a few years became not only the leading and most able editor of his time but he commanded the admiration and praise of the most able men in foreign countries.

During his voyage across the ocean returning from England to America he wrote and committed to paper the following plan which he afterwards followed as his guide through life:

"That it would be necessary for him to be extremely frugal for some time, till he paid what he owed."

"To endeavor to speak the truth in every instance; to give nobody expectations that are not likely to be answered, but aim at sincerity in every word and action—the most amiable excellence in a rational being."

"To apply himself industriously to whatever business taken in hand, and not divert his mind from his business by any foolish project of growing suddenly rich; for industry and patience are the surest means of plenty."

"To speak ill of no man whatever; not even in a matter of truth; but rather by some means excuse the faults heard charged upon others, and upon proper occasions speak all the good he knew of everybody."

Later on he conceived the idea that he would like to live without committing any fault at any time and so as to arrive as nearly as possible to "moral perfection." In order to aid him and serve as a guide in this work he adopted thirteen names of virtues with their precepts as follows:

I. Temperance: Eat not to dullness; drink not to elevation.

II. Silence: Speak not but what may benefit others or yourself; avoid trifling conversations.

III. Order: Let all your things have their places; let each part of your business have its time.

IV. Resolution: Resolve to perform what you ought; perform what you resolve.

V. Frugality: Make no expense but to do good to others or yourself; i. e. waste nothing.

VI. Industry: Lose no time; be always employed in something useful; cut off all unnecessary actions.

VII. Sincerity: Use no hurtful deceit; think innocently and justly; and if you speak, speak accordingly.

VIII. Justice: Wrong none by doing injuries, or omitting the benefits that are your duty.

IX. Moderation: Avoid utterances; forbear resenting injuries so much as you think they deserve.

Cleanliness: Tolerate no uncleanness in body, clothes, or habitation.

XI. Frugality: Be not disturbed at trifles, nor at accidents common or unavoidable.

XII. Chastity.

XIII. Humility: Imitate Jesus."

Many more interesting practices pursued by this most eminent and wise of men could be repeated but space will not permit at this time. The details adopted by this eminent man to aid him in carrying these virtues into effect are most interesting and instructive.

The new year is approaching and there are a great number of young men and women, also also others who are not so young, who would like to do well for their future, who would do well to consider and practice the details planned and followed by this eminent statesman to enable him to arrive at the distinction which followed, his painstaking efforts. 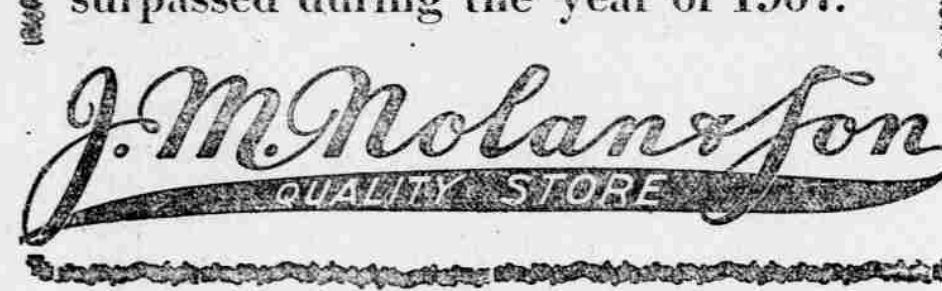
