### "MERRY WAR."

That Ohio will be the scene of unusual political activity between now and the meeting of the national convention which is to nominate a man for election to the presidency in 1908 is very evident. The leaders in the strife are destined to be Senator Foraker and Secretary of War Taft. "Fire-alarm" Foraker is recognized by all as a corporatist first, last and eternally, while Taft is a man fully in sympathy with the policies of President Roosevelt.

Foraker seeks to begot the public mind and make it believe that the Rooseveltian policy of railroad regulation, and the control of corporations in general, is a menace to the commonwealth, a blow at manufacturers, at commerce, in fact, at industrial life in general in the United States. Secretary of War Taft will stand for what the people want and have long desired in having corporations controlled sufficiently to assure all classes "a square deal." It is plain to see who will fare best at the hands of the people.

### MAN'S IMPOTENCY.

"Great is Allah!" Yea, great indeed is some power, call it by any name you choose. The power is the same if called God or Allah, if deified or denied divinity, if worshipped or scoffed at, if petitioned or defied. What a power it must be—a law which governs the universe. In a physical sense alone can man catch a glimmer of this great controlling force, for that which is physical is more readily comprehensible to the human mind.

Worlds are whirled through space as easily as the boy throws his handball, and are always earned by this incomprehensible power. The exactness of the workings of the various nets in their relation to one another would seem to indicate somewhere a fountain-head of this power or wisdom, or whatever it may be in all its intangibility. In comparison, how small and insignificant and impotent is the power of the greatest human mind, marvelous as appears the

resources of the latter.

Instances of these facts are furnished in such catastrophes as visited San Francisco one year ago yesterday. In this case, as in thousands previous, was made manifest the fact that the greatest man was but an atom and his attempts to safeguard against this incomprehensible power in the course of its workings is so weak in reality as to excite human compassion for oneself and kind.

During the past year there have been many of these demonstrations, carrying to eternity thousands of human beings and destroying untold millions of dollar's worth of property. In every instance there has appeared no favored people, religion nor creed—all were alike before this great power, all as the same children, so to speak.

The latest of these demonstrations of force incomprehensible occurred in Mexico a few days ago when there were gathered to their Fathers hundreds of human beings; when the destruction of property exceeded the possibility of estimation; when the earth was opened, shaken, twisted and warped despite the tearful prayers and evidences of human anguish. It was willed so—it had to be. What is the power beside which man is so impotent? The world's greatest are mystified.

Because President Roosevelt is alleged to have referred to Moyer and Haywood, on trial for the murder of the late Gov. Steunenberg of Idaho, as "undesirable citizens" the Chicago Federation of Labor has asked him for an explanation of the meaning of his language. What answer can the president make in order to soothe the sensibilities of a lot of contemptible ignoramus who demand an explanation of his language in such a case? Should Teddy take time to answer there will likely be no misunderstanding as to his meaning in using the language credited him nor in the terms employed in his answer.

### WORTHY OF ATTENTION.

School Directors Take Notice. School Funds to be Forfeited.

I hereby call the attention of the Board of Directors of the several school districts of the county to the new law regulating the holding over of school funds from year to year. Heretofore each district was entitled to hold a sum not to exceed \$50. The new law which goes into effect May 25, 1907, provides that any part of the 85 per cent of the money drawn during the year, and which must be spent for teachers' salary, and for no other purpose, remaining on hand at the end of the school year, is forfeited to the general school fund of the county. On and after May 25, 1907, each district clerk's report will be carefully examined to see that the 85 per cent is spent for teachers' salary and for no other purpose. Therefore each district having on hand any part of this 85 per cent fund at the end of year will forfeit same by virtue of the law. As I have no discretion in the matter but only the law to govern me, districts must look after their interests in the matter. Clerk's salary must not be taken from this 85 per cent fund, it must be taken from the 15 per cent allowed for other purposes.
