LABOR U. S.

The attitude of the Chicago Federation of Labor in its attack on President Roosevelt is a disgrace to all affiliated and sympathizing labor organizations and a reflection upon the people of the nation. Because the president saw fit to refer to Debs, Moyer and Haywood in the same breath with Harriman, all of whom he characterized as "undesirable citizens," the federation was up in arms.

Moyer and Haywood are under indictment as accessories to the murder of Governor Steunenberg of Idaho. The federation claimed that the utterances of the president would be detrimental to the interests of the indicted men when their case came up for a hearing and demanded an explanation and retraction of the chief executive. Roosevelt answered in a manner which should have settled the matter once for all.

In his letter to the federation at Chicago, as given to the public, the president made it very plain that he considered Moyer and Haywood "undesirable citizens," not so much on account of their present plight as on account of their obnoxious past. On account of their past he condemned them and for the same reason he condemned Harriman. But while he made plain his supreme indifference to what the federation might do or Harriman might do, or any other party or parties might attempt in opposition to him, he also gave emphasis to the fact that his first consideration was a square deal for all men under the laws of the land regardless of the fact of personal wealth, power or poverty. A more manly, able and fearless letter could scarcely have been written by any man under the circumstances.

To the shame of the federation at Chicago they again sent an open letter to Roosevelt in which they attempt by threat to force him to "toady" to their caprices. In certain respects

the last letter of the federation borders on the anarchistic and if the conditions of this government are such as make it necessary that the chief executive submit to such devilish attacks we are indeed in a sad way.

We are by nature in sympathy with those who earn their bread by toil, but feel no compassion for those who allow themselves to become pawns in the hands of unscrupulous labor "bosses." For the laboring classes to countenance, much less aid and abet, an attack on Roosevelt seems almost traitorous, for he is the man of all men who stands as a champion of every honest man, be he patrician or plebeian, rich or poor.

DELEGATION ARRIVES.

East Willamette Association Meets Today.
