## Hunting Forbidden.

\$50 reward is hereby offered for the arrest and conviction of the party or parties who trespassed upon my lands, situated west of Corvallis, on or about Sunday the 27th day of September, 1908, and while there shot and crippled one of my registered ewes. The punishment of trespassing upon enclosed lands of another, while hunting, accompanied with a gun and dog is a fine of from \$15 to \$100 or imprisonment from 7 days to 100 days or both fine and imprisonment. The penalties should be inflicted for each offense, because men raising stock cannot afford to have it killed by those directly violating the laws of the state.

## Reward for Trespassers.

\$20 Reward is hereby offered for the arrest and conviction of any person or persons for trespassing at any time upon my lands, near Corvallis, Oregon, while hunting thereon or when found carrying a gun, pistol or other firearms, or accompanied with a dog or dogs, on or across said lands. This is made necessary because I have had valuable stock crippled several times through carelessness of hunters. The penalty for trespassing upon the enclosed lands of another, while hunting, accompanied with gun or dog is a fine from \$15 to \$100, or imprisonment from 7 to 100 days or both fine and imprisonment. Posting of notices to warn trespassers is not necessary. The crime by statute is made a misdemeanor. These penalties will be inflicted unless such parties absent themselves.

## GEOGRAPHIC NAMES

### Commission Held Its First Meeting.

Corvallis, Oct. 29.—Governor Chamberlain recently appointed a Commission in reference to the geographic names of Oregon. This commission held its first meeting yesterday at the Administration Building of the State Agricultural College and effected an organization by electing Will G. Steele of Portland, chairman; Prof. Joseph Schafer of the State University, Eugene, secretary, and Prof. J. B. Horner of the State Agricultural College, Corvallis, treasurer.

The Commission also fixed its official designation, adopting the name "Oregon Geographic Board," which harmonizes with the name of the national organization, the "United States Geographic Board."

It was decided to issue an address to the people of Oregon setting forth in full the objects of the Board, and soliciting the cooperation of the public.

It is understood that the Board has no desire to change names which are established in the thought and affection of the people; but it will be prepared to help the people to select appropriate names where none exist, to eliminate embarrassing duplications, and to settle as far as possible existing disputes in regard to place names. An important part of its work will be the preparation of a report on the origin of the existing geographic names of Oregon. To facilitate this work the counties of the state were assigned as follows: to Mr.

Stark, Multnomah, Clatsop, Hood River, Klamath, Jackson and Josephine; to Mr. Horner, Benton and the Eastern Oregon counties (excepting Klamath); to Mr. Schafer the remaining counties of Western Oregon. All citizens possessed of information which they wish to communicate to the Board are invited to address any of the three members as they may see fit. The Board will be very glad to learn about unnamed places, such as lakes, streams, waterfalls, mountains, passes, etc., which in the estimation of the people living in their vicinity are deserving of special designations; it will also appreciate information concerning names which are considered wholly inappropriate or duplicate names and particularly about cases of disputed names, that is, where two or more names are applied to the same place. In this last case the communication of facts connected with the origin of the name so applied may be of great service towards enabling the Board to suggest a solution for the difficulty.

Pioneer settlers of Oregon can be of special service to the Board if they will write, giving the history of names whose origins are familiar to them. Several letters of this character have already been received. For example, one pioneer, Judge Smith of Roseburg, writes about the history of the naming of the towns of Corvallis and Eugene. Judge Smith was a friend of E. Gene Skinner, who once told him that J. C. Avery had got ahead of him in applying the name Marysville to a town—Avery gave the name to the town afterward called Corvallis—saying that it had been his [Skinner's] intention to name the place founded, by him Marysville in honor of Mrs. Skinner; since the name was in use elsewhere he would have to call his place Eugene, which he did.
