THE PEOPLE'S CAUSE.

The issue in California to-day is clear-cut and well defined. The battle of the people against corporate power has been declared. The Democracy under the leadership of Gen. Stoneman has ably espoused the cause of the people. The Republican party with its well-known affinity for wealth and corruption will champion the cause of the corporations. We shall see what we shall see! No political contest for years will be watched with so much interest as the conflict in our neighboring state. Blessed as she has been by gold-fields unsurpassed, by a delicious and health giving climate, by grand and awe-inspiring scenery, by a most fertile soil and men of push, energy and nerve, California to-day should be the most prosperous, thriving and advancing state in the Union. That she is not is due to the methods, the corruption and the villainy of the Republican party. That party brought upon her the curse of Mongolianism and cheap labor; it cursed her with Sir Claus Spreckles and his sugar monopoly; it cursed her with railroad legislation that to-day makes the Central Pacific railroad the despot of her borders; and it has driven from her territory the workmen and made of those that remain outcasts and political agitators, who are compelled to cry aloud from the sand-lots. THE SITUATION IN PENNSYLVANIA.

The disaffection of the Republicans in Pennsylvania, threatens to be more serious to their organization than was at first anticipated by their bosses. With the overthrow of the Cameron Dynasty in that State will follow the speedy disembarkment of the Republican party. Democratic triumph in Pennsylvania at this time means a Waterloo defeat to the Republicans in 1884. Strange as it may appear no person has ever served as President who failed to get a majority of the electoral votes of the Keystone State. A defeat of the Republican ticket at this time with the existing breach among their leaders, and the tendency to break from party allegiance, that is their manifest, and the increasing disregard of the people for bossism will so completely overthrow the organization within that commonwealth that it will be impossible for the Cameron faction, with all their wealth and influence, backed as they are by the United States Treasury to rally their clans successfully for the Presidential Campaign of 1884. So much importance is attached to this fact by the moneyed power, who own and control the organization which administers the Government, that since their failure or plateau the disaffected leaders, who have set up an Independent ticket in open hostility to the regular organization, that they are concentrating the influence of the entire party within that State with a purpose and design by corrupt practices and open defiance of law to defeat and overwhelm the Democratic party, and smother and crush out the disaffected organization within their own ranks. On the other hand the Democracy have placed in the field a strong ticket composed of men of known probity, in whom the great laboring masses of the people have confidence, and whose only weakness is that they will be opposed by the gigantic corporations with which that commonwealth is environed who want no person in power except those whom they can control, whilst the half-breeds or Independents present a bold front and refuse any overtures which the stalwarts are willing to concede. The situation becomes more perplexing to the Machine Manager's, and they redouble their exertion to avert the pending danger to their corrupt existence, and secure for themselves a longer lease of power and plunder. To what extent they will go to hold fast to the public patronage remains to be seen. That they will not stop short of bribery, perjury and corruption, to carry their ends, will not be questioned by any reader of history who recalled, how the old Grant ring in 1872, after the registry law, went into force in that state, voted through their repeaters and strikers over seven thousand tombstone inscriptions in the City of Philadelphia alone, many of the persons who voted by their repeaters on these false certificates of registration, had been buried for more than a generation. As the time for the election approaches and the canvas waxes warmer and it becomes evident that those who have grown rich, through unjust legislation will resort to desperate means to retain the power on which they have fattened, and if enough of the profligate class who lounge about, without any calling or politics, who are ever ready to sell for a few dollars, can be found in the numerous cities, towns and villages within that commonwealth, to override the will of the industrious and working class, the means will be at hand to command a solid phalanx of this army of profligates, and the iron bands of arrogance and oppression, will become more firmly riveted upon the labor of that State. But if we read the signs of the times aright bossism is at an end, and the power which has hold of the laboring people of that State in the iron grasp of oppression must succumb to justice and equality before the law, and with a return to peace, plenty, prosperity and quietude within that commonwealth where capital will respect and reward labor and labor will appreciate capital, and the day for strikes will have passed forever.
