HIGH LICENSE.—Hon. C. F. Manderson, the new Nebraska senator, says of the liquor law of that state: "It is the best liquor law in the United States. The license for cities is \$1000 a year, and in small towns \$500 a year. Before it went into effect Omaha had 160 saloons, and some of them were pretty bad. Now the number has been reduced to 90, a little more than one half. When there were 160 saloons, paying \$100 a year, the revenue was yielded \$16,000; now the 90 under the new law yield \$90,000 a year. The new law is of great benefit to the body politic, in that it has cut off all the little low doggeries, which were the ones that made trouble, and the character of the men who keep saloons is better. The bond required of them is \$5000; and one saloon keeper is not allowed to go on the bond of another."

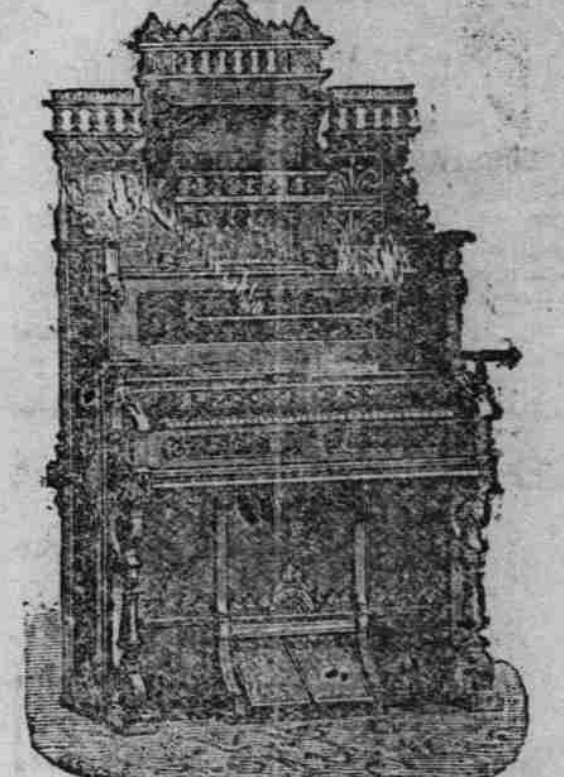
