

THE TARIFF.

The leading Republican papers of the East have started the slogan that the Democratic newspapers of the country are about to ruin their party by forcing the issue of a tariff for revenue only.

We remember that in 1876 the Democratic party gained a splendid victory when an emphatic declaration on this question formed a most conspicuous part of their platform, and was endorsed by an overwhelming majority of the legal voters of the entire country.

It has degraded American commerce from the first to an inferior rank on the high seas.

It has cut down the sale of American manufactures at home and abroad, and depleted the returns of American agriculture—an industry followed by half our people.

It costs the people five times more than it produces to the treasury, obstructs the process of production and wastes the fruits of labor.

It promotes fraud, fosters smuggling, enriches officials and bankrupts honest merchants.

We demand that all custom-house taxation shall be only for revenue.
