Postal Telegraphy.

Since the strike of the Western Union Telegraph operators, and the derangement of commercial business incident to the uncertain facilities of telegraphic communication, the propriety of a postal telegraph system has been widely discussed by the leading journals of the country. The project is apparently not only feasible, but the need of the facilities it will supply is pressing. If public sentiment, so far as we are able to discern it now, be any indication of what popular feeling will be when Congress meets, there is little question that the scheme will be carnestly urged upon the Government.

There is no doubt that under the constitutional power to "establish post offices and post routes" the government has the same right to send let ers by telegraph as it has by mail, and it is as JONES' MINERAL WATER! much its duty to provide for the quicker transmission of correspondence in this manner as it was to substitute the mail car for the stage coach. The inauguration of such a system would be attended with no difficulties. 
