RECIPE FOR PREPARING SHEEP-DIP.—Take one-half pound of unslacked lime, put in enough water to slack thoroughly; when well slacked add one gallon of water and one pound of sulphur; boil until the sulphur is well dissolved, then add three gallons of water. Use it from 115 to 125 degrees in heat; let sheep remain in one minute.
