

FOREIGN TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

Lieutenant General Aye commands the expedition to Khartoum. The naval expedition starts immediately from Cairo to Assouan. A serious fire is raging in Kief, Russia. Many houses have been burned. The wood yards at Aberdeen were burned recently. The loss is \$20,000. There were thirteen deaths from yellow in Havana during the week ending Saturday. The cable steamship Faraday has arrived at the port. She is proceeding to connect the cables. There has been a terrific cyclone in Akah, British Burma. Immense damage is reported. King Leopold gave a grand banquet in Brussels recently to the King and Queen of Holland. A Sydney dispatch says that Hanlan won the sculling match with Laycock by half a length. The British ship Syria has been wrecked on the Fiji islands. Seventy passengers were drowned. In India the natives have hoarded \$1,000,000 worth of gold, which cannot be got into circulation. Of 11,488 natives who left Hamburg for foreign countries during March, all but 75 were bound for America. Mexican agents are persuading Cuban tobacco planters to move to Mexico. Seventy-two have decided to do so. Swiss legislators are once more discussing the propriety of suppressing the Salvation Army in that country. In Sweden, it is said, there is a law taking away the right of suffrage from every man who has been drunk three times. Three cotton warehouses in Liverpool, belonging to Molyneux & Taylor, were recently damaged by fire to the extent of \$100,000. The steamer Castala Paterna, for New York from St. Denis, Spain, was wrecked a part of her cargo. Rough weather prevented assistance. The international exhibition of motors and implements for the year 1900 is to be opened at Vienna on July 24th, will close on October 12th. The premier majority in England is enjoyed by Winchester, and its seven hundred anniversary will be celebrated in the course of the present year. Anton Dvorak, in addition to his work for the Worcester and Birmingham festivals, has undertaken to compose a new oratorio for the Leeds festival of 1900. Rubenstein's new work, recently given seven times in succession in Moscow, is the opera Rubenstein considers his best work. A Spanish nobleman, named Count Ernest de Vallegas, recently pleaded guilty in the Manchester police court to swindling a railroad company in the matter of fares. A severe shock of earthquake was felt recently through the peninsula of Szechuan in Asia Minor. Several villages were damaged, many houses destroyed and twenty persons killed. The Pall Mall Gazette says: Wolsley will command an expedition in the autumn which will land at Fushan and march to Berber. A military railway will be built across the desert in June. The festival of the celebration of the 50th anniversary of the death of John Wycliffe, the earliest English reformer and translator of the Bible, took place at St. Andrew's church in London. The law has been invoked in Manchester, England, to prevent criminals from surrendering themselves as prey to the mongers, which seems to delight in torturing its victims before killing them outright. The Spanish Cortes have paid \$200,000 for the library of the late Duke of Osuna. The collection consists of 2,710 volumes of manuscript and 33,567 volumes of printed books, many of which in both batches are unique. The present registered British voters are as follows: England, 1,018,433; Scotland, 310,441; Ireland, 224,018; total, 1,552,912. The present number of members is: For England, 439; Scotland, 69; Ireland, 103; total, 611. Mme. De Kalemire, the "left-handed" wife of the Grand Duke Louis of Hesse-Darmstadt, will defend herself against the Grand Duke's suit for divorce. He charges that his wife concealed a child before marriage. Private advice from Vice President and Manager Van Horne, of the Canadian Pacific, says no more work will be done on the line, or extensions of present branches made this season. He says Stevens has failed in securing money in England for the extension of the Manitoba and South-western. Theduty on cattle and sheep has doubled. Le Paris says: French artists will receive the refusal of the United States Congress to reduce the duty on works of art. They will, the paper says, demand that the French salon exclude the works of American artists. The Crown Prince will attend the marriage of Grand Duke Sergius, of Russia, of the Czar, at St. Petersburg, June 11. The Czarina passed through Berlin last week on the way to Hanoverheim. The Emperor was at the depot and greeted the Czarina cordially. The second game of American lacrosse was played in England last week. The Lancashire opponents of the Americans won four to nothing. During the play for the second goal one of the Lancashire men was compelled to retire from the field on account of injuries received. The Monterey Revista, an influential journal, in an editorial upon the present state of affairs in Mexico, closes with this significant sentence: "It is the functional law of the nationalists that excessive tyranny may sooner or later produce liberty. Do you understand? Our final destiny is to become a monarchy." The London Telegraph and Standard are leading articles to San Ward. He is spoken of as generous and sympathetic, and as most genial and cosmopolitan. His last arrival in London, it is said, was with a chorus of delight. Princely houses opened their doors wide and welcomed him with hospitable warmth. It is expected that the President, within a few days, will make proclamation of the ratification of the treaty entered into between the United States and Mexico. To make this treaty effective legislation is required by Congress, and it will be introduced in the House as soon as the official notification of the ratification of the treaty is received by the President. In the Commons recently the bill amending the Irish Land Act of 1881 was rejected, 138 to 75. Parnell complained of the opposition offered by Trevelyan, chief secretary for Ireland. It is stated that a bill will not find fault if it meets with retaliation. He asked if the government meant to wait until publication of the bill in the House over the heads of dissenting landlords. A quarrel between "Plunger" Walton and the German doctor Loefler, culminated in a fight, in London, last week, about the professional charges of the latter. Mr. Walton got angry and finally struck the doctor on the nose. Loefler hit him in the hand, and was then whipped and retorted by stoutly belaboring "Plunger" on the head and shoulders with that weapon. Vanderhill's fellow passengers who were up from Liverpool to London on the train with him, have a wild theory that he engineered the whole party, and timed his departure from New York very skillfully, so that his hand might not be seen in the transaction. In support of this theory they say that he received a deluge of cables-grams on the arrival of the Baltic at Queenstown, and that he smiled very significantly as he leisurely read the dispatches.

DOMESTIC TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

J. L. Brownell & Co., New York, have failed. Five criminals were publicly whipped at Newcastle, Del., recently. Max Muller has been appointed postmaster at Jacksonville, Oregon. It is understood that the findings of the coroner are adverse to General Swain. In portions of Texas last week severe hail storms seriously damaged the crops. The name of the office at Bethany, Washington Territory, has been changed to Pittsburg. Frost a few days ago in Lancaster county, Pa., caused great damage to the growing tobacco. The President has approved the bill granting a loan of \$1,000,000 to the New Orleans Exposition. Patrick Patterly whipped Curley Hughes in three rounds at Rochester last week. Both men were arrested. Arthur D. Patterson, of Champaign, Ill., was found dead on his father's doorstep recently, shot through the brain. Endicott has resigned the presidency of the Oregon and Transcontinental. Elijah Smith has been elected as his successor. Over 4,000 Chicago people have signed the pledge and now wear the blue ribbon as the result of Francis Murphy's labors. The strawberry crop in southern Illinois is likely to prove a failure, owing to the appearance within ten days of insects and rust. J. C. Tietjens, the insolvent wagon and implement maker of Lyons, Iowa, owes about \$20,000, and can pay but fifty cents on the dollar. Tully H. Smith, a prominent business man of Milwaukee, Wis., who disappeared several days ago, committed suicide at New Orleans. It is now understood that the April earnings of the Union Pacific will show a decrease from \$1,000,000 to \$500,000, compared with last year. The famous old horse ridden by General Custer in his Indian campaigns, died at Vincennes, Ind., last week. He was the property of Dr. W. F. Carver, the marksman. Representative Muey denied that he has expressed any intention of declining the Congressional nomination in his district and starting a newspaper in San Francisco. It is reported that Jay Gould, in view of the uncertainties of Wall street, so strikingly demonstrated recently, has invested \$1,500,000 in government bonds in his wife's name. A stock train on the Missouri Pacific Railroad struck a land slide near Leavenworth, Kansas, Sunday afternoon, and the opera rubbed cars tipped over into the river, causing the death of eighty head of cattle. The convention of brewers of the United States was in session at Rochester last week. The attendance was large. The hall was elaborately decorated with appropriate mottoes, German and English. Postmaster-General Gresham has ordered that all matter to be sent from New York, New Orleans and Galveston to Mexico by sea, should hereafter be sent by the Pasa over the Mexican Central railroad. Ellett, Dewey & Co., Richmond, Va., wholesale drug goods dealers, have assigned liabilities, \$200,000; assets not known. Dewey, they say, will pay dollar for dollar. Preferred creditors amount to \$100,000. Four lots on the west side of New York city have been disposed of by Jerome B. Chase. The lots are on the corner of U. S. Grant, Jr., to Chaffee on the 7th of this month. Articles of agreement have been signed between Daniel Ross, of Cleveland, and Matsada Sorackich, the Japanese champion. Ross is to get \$500 if he can win three out of four fights. The match will take place June 30 in New York city. Through the untiring efforts of his wife, Edward Bruce has been pardoned from the Iowa penitentiary, where he had been sentenced for life for the murder of Melvin Namur, a grocer in Chicago. The former couple have gone to Dakota. Geo. B. Hulme, of Wyoming, receiver for Rufus Hatch's Yellowstone Hotel Company, was appointed in the interest of John Douglas and his associates. Hatch stockholders, has come out of the park and reported the entire failure of his enterprise. A prominent cattle man of Texas, who has just returned to St. Louis from an extensive tour in the cattle region and some of the northern markets, says that the outlook for beefs is very bright. He reports that some advanced herds from Texas have already arrived at Dodge City, Kansas. Simpson, of Dennell, Lawson & Simpson, New York, stated to an associated press reporter the other day that they will pay one-half of their indebtedness in twelve months, and the remainder in two years, if the terms are accepted by nine-tenths of their creditors, both in amounts and numbers.
