Death of Joseph S. Smith.

Hon. Joseph S. Smith died at his residence in Portland on Sunday afternoon at 4 o'clock. While his death was not unanticipated, yet it was not expected at this time any more than for years past, as he was not reported in any worse health than he has been for some time. Mr. Smith was truly a pioneer in Oregon, and there is no man more respected and honored. He came to this State in 1845, and has lived in this city, Oregon City, Salem and on the Sound. He was a man of marked ability, as a public speaker, lawyer and business man, and one of the most faithful public officials that has ever honored the State. For several years past, his health has been poor, and he was forced in consequence to give up active business and seek a change of climate. Mr. Smith's last political campaign was in 1868, when he made his famous contest against David Logan, and while his abilities were recognized before, he surpassed all expectations of his friends, with his powers and abilities as a public speaker. He defeated Mr. Logan by 1290 majority, while the Republicans carried the state two years previous to 1868. He was the Democratic nominee for Governor in 1882, but his health prevented him from active participation in the canvass. As a business man, Mr. Smith stood high and was very successful. As a citizen he held the esteem and love of all. He leaves a wife, to whom he was married at Salem in 1849 (now Miss Julia A. Carter), two sons, Walter N. Smith, who is now in Europe, Preston C. Smith, and a daughter, Mrs. H. Y. Thompson. He has also two brothers, Dr. W. K. and A. T. Smith, in this city.—Standard.

Daniel T. Hill of Coquille City, Coos county, who was arrested and taken to Portland last Spring charged with complicity in robbing the mail sacks between Canas Valley and Myrtle Point, and because insane from the effects of his imprisonment, died in the asylum on the 14th of September. It was owing to statements of the Stillwells, his brothers-in-law, that Hill was arrested. Their story was shown on cross examination to be untrue and Hill was released, but with liberty of body came the wreck of his mind and he showed symptoms of insanity before reaching his home, and was soon after sent to the asylum. Hill was a blacksmith and an excellent workman. He was a large man and possessed of a liberal education, with a very sensitive nature.
