In the Congress elected in the Presidential year of 1880, the House contained 293 members. Under the new apportionment, which went into operation in 1882, the number of members was raised to 325. Under the old apportionment Ohio had 20 members; under the new she has 21. Of the 20 elected in 1880, when Garfield carried the State by 34,000 plurality, 15 were Republicans.



CLEVELAND AND VICTORY!

OHIO STILL THE BATTLE GROUND!

The Tuesday elections is more than gratifying to the Democracy. West Virginia has elected a Democratic Governor and the entire State ticket by a majority of 10,000. Ohio has a Republican majority of about 9,000, out of eight hundred thousand voters on the State ticket, but elects a majority of Democratic Congressmen. The Republican gals over last year's election are principally in the large cities of over twenty thousand inhabitants, where posses of Deputy United States Marshals invaded the sanctity of the ballot and shot down peaceful citizens for exercising the elective franchise.

The Republicans under the personal supervision of the magnetic Blaine attempted the most gigantic frauds ever perpetrated upon the freedom of elections; all that organization and money could do was done to corrupt the voters, and in order to swell the Republican vote negro repeaters were imported from Kentucky into Cincinnati. Countless numbers of the worst ruffians of the city were deputized as United States Marshals, with clubs and firearms invaded the polling places, and whenever these strange negroes were challenged would arrest the challengers and the repeaters would rush in their votes amidst these disturbances.

In order to preserve peace comparative quiet prevailed throughout the city, although numerous conflicts occurred at the various voting places, brought on by the illegal and violent actions of these Deputy United States Marshals and quite a number of persons were killed or wounded. The importation of the repeaters will account for the large increase in the vote of the State. With all this opposition the Democrats have held their own. And the Republicans have been easily defeated by the law of多数 (most). The first result of this election for the Democrats, rested on the exercise of the electoral franchise by negro repeaters, and the subsequent government.
