We took a trip to Brewster last week which was one of much interest and pleasure. After traveling all forenoon in the fog, we climbed to the top of Weekly mountain and saw, as far as the eye could see, a perfect ocean of fog bounded by distant mountains, many of which were covered with snow. After a short rest on the top of the mountain we descended the Coquille from its source, through all its windings for several miles. For splendid timber and magnificent scenery there is no place that can surpass the canon of the Coquille. A long day's drive brought us to the hospitable house of Mr. Laird, where we found excellent accommodations. We were shown a specimen of those immense potatoes you have before heard of, and also very fine apples. We saw the wing of a vulture that had been killed on the top of Brewster mountain by George Miller. The wing when spread measured over four feet. The land from which the wing was taken must have measured over ten feet from tip to tip. The next morning we left Brewster with a very excited idea of the capabilities of a valley which could produce such cattle, hogs, birds, vegetables and fruit as we saw samples of.
