

FOREIGN TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

Paris has resumed its usual appearance. The Austrian navy is to be re-organized. France makes 7,750,000 umbrellas every year. France is preparing to clear Tonquin of the Chinese. The annual number of births in London exceeds 200,000. The French Deputies have adopted the Tonquin credits. England's colonial interests in Africa are menaced by Germany. It is probable that France will send 15,000 more troops to China. Signor Pessina has been appointed Minister of Justice at Rome. France has raised the duty on foreign grain two francs per cent. British troops in the Sudan are moving southward to avoid smallpox. A general election in England is confidently predicted for January. The English Cabinet has failed to agree on a scheme of redistribution. It is reported that there is an outbreak of cholera on French ships in China. An Austrian anarchist has been sentenced to nine years imprisonment. Ferry says that all hopes of peace between France and China is at an end. There are 20,000,000 people in Austro-Hungary who never read a newspaper. The London six days walking match was won by Littlewood, he covering 47 miles. Albert Victor, the Prince of Wales' eldest son, has been entered as a law student. Zober Pasha has been ordered to take up his residence at Alexandria under surveillance. Phylloxera has made its appearance in the Pomological Institute of Proskau (Silesia). The steamer Mella, from Genoa, has been refused entrance to the port of Buenos Ayres. Patti has the right to re-marry according to the terms of the divorce recently granted her in Paris. Three hundred arrests have been made in connection with the latest plot to murder the Czar. Highlanders of Victoria, B. C., threaten to kill policemen if they arrest any of their number. A messenger has arrived at Dengola with a message from General Gordon eight weeks old. A water famine at Manchester, Eng., threatens the stoppage of the mills and other industries. One county in Australia has this year paid the bounty on 25,540 dozen of captured sparrows' eggs. Sir John McDonald, the Canadian Premier, was the recipient of a banquet in London last week. The English government's redistribution bill differs very much from the original draft of the ministers. Angling on the Upper Thames, above Staines, is now wholly prohibited by those who own the fisheries. Sir John A. Macdonald of Canada has received from Queen Victoria the honor of the Grand Cross of Bath. The production and value of the French oyster fisheries has wonderfully increased during the last few years. The Prince of Saxe Meiningen has separated from his wife, a daughter of the Crown Prince of Germany. Montreal, Can., is undergoing a double infliction—diphtheria and typhoid fever—the result of defective sewerage. The French people have grown tired of all the wonderful inventions of the age, and now want an electric coupe. High Sheriff Harris, of Victoria, B. C., died last week of paralysis of the brain. He was a pioneer of San Francisco. The German Reichstag has voted in favor of the payment of salaries to its members. Bismarck opposed the measure. Scarborough, worsted spinners of Halifax, Eng., have failed for £130,000. The failure was caused by depression in trade. Emperor William has divided the Schiller prize for the best German drama between Paul Heyse and Ernst Willdenbruch. Steamers and junks are now running the blockade in China, the blockading fleet not being sufficient to prevent their passing. It is estimated that 100,000 persons left Paris during the cholera epidemic. The people are now returning in great numbers. The German authorities with a view to discourage emigration, have forbidden the railways to carry emigrants at reduced rates. It is officially stated that Germany's intentions with regard to Zanzibar extend only to the commutation of a commercial treaty. The Italian Minister at Buenos Ayres has protested against the refusal of the government to allow the steamer Perseo to enter the port. Ferry says that the American Minister at Peking had offered to mediate between France and China, but the Cabinet felt bound to decline. Radical newspapers of Paris accuse the government of angering the crowds on Sunday by a needless display of the police and military force. An edict has gone forth from the Parisian police that public gambling must cease. Twenty-three gambling clubs are said to have already been closed. The Parnellites, contrary to the expectation of the Tories, voted with the Liberals on the second passage of the franchise bill in the House of Commons. Although the Marquis of Lorne was one of the noblemen nominated recently for the Chancellorship of Glasgow University, he did not receive one vote. Until lately most of the supply of sugar in Denmark was imported. Now the material for sugar is provided within the boundaries of the kingdom. The latest advices from the British Afghan frontier commission stated that the commission had arrived at Herat, and were received most cordially. The unsatisfactory state of the British navy continues to engross public attention in England, now that the excitement over the franchise bill has subsided. A dispatch from Paris says the French government has resolved to send two more cruisers to the west coast of Africa in view of possible results in the Congo conference. The Tlaxohome claimant proposes to lay his case before the public by means of public meetings. Many influential men in England still believe him to be the veritable Sir Roger. The Nile is falling rapidly. Large lugs are consequently unable to pass the cataracts, and will possibly return, and the expedition will be deferred until the next rising of the river. The British force in Egypt numbers 16,000 men, including 9,000 troops of Assouan, only two regiments remaining in Cairo. The leaving of such a small garrison there is thought to be unwise. Owing to the great pressure of business engagements, Stanley has been obliged to decline an invitation by the Geographical Society of Vienna, to deliver in that city a course of lectures on his African explorations. The Supreme Court at Zurich, Switzerland, has confirmed the acquittal of six anarchists condemned by a local court for conspiracy against their respective governments. An Austrian and two Germans will probably be expelled from the country, the evidence not warranting an extradition.

DOMESTIC TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

A Chinese gullid has been formed at Philadelphia. Fred Archer, the English jockey, has arrived in New York. The name of Cleveland has been given to a Kentucky village. James L. Pugh has been chosen United States Senator from Alabama. The Red Cross Association of Washington will aid the suffering poor of Virginia. The case of the Government vs. the Union Pacific Railroad is on trial at Washington. Frank Chanfrau's estate, valued at \$100,000, goes to his widow, Mrs. Henrietta Chanfrau. General Comu Ojama Irawo, Japanese Minister of War, and suite has arrived in New York. A New Hampshire woman is under \$2,000 bonds on a charge of robbing her grandmother. General W. S. Rosecrans, of California, is mentioned as Secretary of War in Cleveland's Cabinet. The assessors of Atlanta, Ga., make the valuation of that city \$2,068,356 greater than it was last year. The stockholders of the Texas Pacific Railroad have accepted a proposition for reorganization. Rev. James Elijah Labmer, dean of the school of theology of the Boston University, died suddenly the other day. The Bennett-Mackay cable is carried across the big Brooklyn bridge on hooks at an annual rental of \$250 per annum. Mrs. Kimball, a philanthropist, distributed to the poor of New York on Thanksgiving Day over 3,000 pounds of food. The Mutual News Company, of Boston, gave the newboys of that city a regular Thanksgiving dinner on Thanksgiving Day. The American ship A. G. Ropes is the largest wooden ship afloat. She spreads 8,250 square yards of canvas, under full sail. Work in all coal mines in the anthracite regions of Pennsylvania has been suspended for seven weeks, beginning with last Wednesday. Michael William Balfe, son of Balfe the composer, was arrested in New York last week on a charge of assault and battery on a woman. The Mexican commission to the World's Exposition, accompanied by the Eighth Massachusetts Cavalry band, have arrived in New Orleans. The Chippewa Indians, in northern Minnesota, are in a state of agitation over the non-payment of the annuity allowed them by the government. Trouble is expected. The council of the Cherokee nation has passed a bill excluding all white men, preachers, laborers and teachers, with respect to age or previous condition, from the nation. Hugh Campbell, a brother of Chief of Police Campbell of Brooklyn, was found dead in Canal street, New York, the other morning. The police are making an investigation. Rear Admiral Jewett has suggested to the Secretary of the Navy that the North Atlantic squadron be sent to New Orleans to take part in the opening ceremonies of the exposition. The blacksmiths at Oliver Bros. Tenth-street, Philadelphia, have been notified of a 20 per cent reduction in take effect soon. A meeting will be held soon to consider the reduction. Farmer Marshall, of Olean, Cattaraugus county, N. Y., on whose farm oil was discovered recently, sold the other day for \$350,000. The land he owned was being satisfied with an offer of \$3,000. George I. Seney, who some years ago gave a large sum to the endowment of the Lucy Cobb Institute of Athens, Ga., is visiting that city, and is being unremittingly honored by the people of all classes. The President has appointed George B. Anderson, of New York, Indian Inspector, vice Barr, resigned, and Charles F. Ashley, of New York, agent of the Indians of Colorado River Agency, vice Clark, resigned. Frank Casey (colored), who murdered Charles Watson in Arguente, opposite Little Rock, Ark. in September, was hanged last week. He acknowledged the deed, but pleaded drunkenness and denied intending to kill Watson. Haul and Eddie, aged 13 and 11 years, sons of William Creed, who lives a few miles northeast of Mitchell, Dak., on a farm, returned out on the thin ice on the mill pond last week and both fell through and were drowned. A strong effort is being made by the friends of Sergeant Brainerd, who has achieved such an enviable reputation in the Greely expedition, to have him appointed to a vacant vacancy in the army. Such a position is now vacant. A party of a dozen armed men, calling themselves "regulators," went to the house of John Hughes, in Pine Grove, Rowan county, Ky., the other night, on pretense of whipping him. Hughes resisted and was killed. Three men have been arrested, charged with the murder. A McKeesport, Pa., dispatch of last week says: A boy and a girl named Kennedy were walking on the railroad track in the third ward, when they were struck by an engine and both killed. They were not related to each other and both were aged 17. The people of Virginia and immediate vicinity are being attacked by a mysterious disease, and die within a few days after the attack. It is supposed to be mineral poison, caused by drinking water from nearby dried up streams during the recent drought. Rev. William H. Ramsar, superintendent of a "Home for Children and Seminary for Girls," in New York, has been convicted of sending out children to beg provisions for the home, and sentenced to thirty days imprisonment and pay a fine of \$200. A full bench at Worcester, Mass., last week overruled the exceptions and affirmed the verdict of manslaughter against Dr. Pierce, who applied kerosene to the chest and chest of a patient named Mary Bednis and caused her death a year ago. An insane woman named Newcomb, between Moberly and Brunswick, Mo., last week, jumped from a Cannon-ball train while in motion. At the time of the leap she held a baby under each arm, which, singular to say, were not hurt, while she was fatally injured. J. C. Fitzgerald, of Greenville, S. C., a photographer, painter, pencil and brush artist of considerable reputation in that city, has invented a machine worked by compressed air for instantaneous photography whereby a picture can be taken in less than one-fifth of a second. It is learned that the Colonel of the Fifth Regiment, located in Cleveland, O., is enlisting a company for service in the Hocking Valley, as the Governor has at last concluded to call on the state militia. The situation in the valley is growing desperate, and bloodshed is feared. A Washington dispatch says: The Gardfield statute committee have decided upon the circle at the point where Maryland avenue reaches the capitol grounds, westward from the building, as the site for the statue to be erected by the Army of the Government. It will be in prominent view of visitors to the capitol. Dr. John Maxwell, of Springfield, O., the other day after sending his wife out shopping, administered to his four children, aged from 4 to 13, a combination of account books, a dictionary and a book on bed covering their faces with chloroform-saturated rags. He then took a like dose. The children died, but he recovered, and was placed in jail.
