

THE CABINET.

Thos. Francis Bayard has been appointed Cleveland's Secretary of State. Mr. Bayard is a lawyer by profession and is recognized as one of the eminent statesmen of America.

Daniel Manning, of New York, in becoming Secretary of the Treasury, accepts his first office. He is a remarkable example of the magnificent system of our free institutions.

L. Q. C. Lamar, Secretary of the Interior, is one of the best known of Southern statesmen. He is brilliant and aggressive, and with a warm and generous temperament, he counts his friends by the thousands.

William C. Whitney, of New York, Secretary of the Navy, is a man of the same mould as Grover Cleveland. A hard-working, pains-taking lawyer of sound brain force.

Wm. Endicott, of Massachusetts, is the least known of all the Cabinet, and has the Portfolio of the War department. He has been a Supreme Judge and a candidate for Governor of Massachusetts.
