#### A Business Administration-

The administration of Grover Cleve land as President of the United States will go down in history as the "Business Administration." Being at peace with all the world, the great questions that are now before the people are to be solved in the same manner that a business man would conduct his transactions. The mere routine of the complicated business of the general government is to receive more attention than under any former President. Retrenchment and economy are to be the guiding stars of President Cleveland's term. Already in the mere nec essary work of the executive mansion, four clerks with an aggregate salary of \$6,200 have been dismissed without successors. And it is asserted that the pruning knife will cut off throughout the United States some 20,000 offices, whose aggregate salaries would be in the neighborhood of \$30,000,000 annually, or a saving of \$120,000,000 in a single Presidential term! President Cleveland does soule twelve hours hard work every day, the Cabinet officers do as much-each one having perfect control over his own department, as in well regulated business establishment The government is no longer run by \$1,000 clerks. With regard to the offices, no one is to be disturbed except for cause. When terms expire, Democrats, of course, will be selected. By this means, the civil service law will be enforced in spirit and in fact, The truth of the matter is, President Cleveland has taken off his cont, shocked Washington seciety, has no use for politicians, and is determined to give to the people an honest, able and upright administration, like unto the days of our fathers.

#### The Public School

The district school at Roseburg for the year 1885 and 1886 to embrace nine school months, or three quarters of twelve weeks each is intended and exrected to be a free school. And for t're reasons hereinafter stated, we have tinue as nearly as possible as follows: ter, Winter Term to begin Monday, December 7th and end Friday, March 12th. Third Quarter, Spring Term, to begin Monday, March 22d and end Friday, June 11th. Thus giving sufficient vacation between terms and for the holidays. The first Monday in September next is as soon as the school can be started, because no teachers are vet employed. There being 507 persons within the district between the ages of four and twenty-one, and who are entitled to attend the school, to say nothing of some-coming in from outside the district, we know with good teachers and a free school there will te fully as many pupils attend as four teachers can manage to advantage. It is essential that teachers, as nearly as possible, every way qualified and competent be secured. Patrons should consider it a waste of their money to have it paid to unqualified and incom-

petent teachers.

It is not the work of only a day or a week to select and contract with four teachers such as are likely to give general satisfaction to the patrons of the school. To secure the principal, as there must be one, who is in every way competent and qualified is probably the most difficult part of the business of securing teachers. While good teachers are required for the lower or primary department, equally as competent | in their respective departments as the principal, at the same time the principal must possess the learning, exper. ience and judgment to fit him, not only to conduct his own department successfully, but each and all the other department. He must understand the correct methods of teaching of classifyng, of advancing the scholars, and the rules of discipline for the government and regulation of the several departments and the general management of the whole school. He must be able to maintain amicable relations and barmeny among the teachers. He must possess the experience, energy and industry together with the requisite education to create and maintain an interest in the work I'v both teachers and

The patrons of the school pay the taxes, they furnish the money, they want and are entitled to the largest possible benefit for every dollar. Then to secure teachers and principal, and to start and secure the kind of school desued is manifestly a responsible duty. To perform the duty and accomplish the desired object, we do not see the way clear or safe to try to start the school before September. If all the tax levied is collected, together with the public money, there will not be more money at our command than will support one full term of nine months free school; and we think it best to arrange as above. If for no other reasons, the fact that teachers are not employed and that there has not been time since the annual school meeting to arrange matters relating to the school and employment of teachers, and will not be time enough to do so, sufficient reasons for not having a free term of school this Spring. We do not suppose a majority of the patrons are anx. ious to relieve the directors of the duty and responsibility of securing and employing teachers in time for a Spring T. R. Sheridan and J. P.
