DUTIES OF TEACHERS. SECTION 1 Teachers shall be in attendance at their respective schoolrooms and open the same for the reception of pupils, twenty minutes bemorning and remain on the school premises until school closes in the afternoon.

SEC. 2. When pupils are passing in or out at the opening and closing of school, at noon and at recess, teachers are required to give their personal attention to the preservation of order in their rooms, in the halls and on the stairs.

SEC. 3. Teachers shall see that their pupils do not gather at the school building before 8:40 o'clock A. M., and that they do not remain about the school premises after the closing of the school in the afternoon, without special permission.

SEC. 4. It shall be a duty of the first importance on the part of teachers to exercise a care and vigilance over their pupils on the play ground; and to hold them accountable for their conduct to and from school; and on all suitable occasions, to instruct and encourage them in forming correct habits, manners and principles.

SEC. 5. They shall, within one day after the close of each School month make accurate reports to the Principal according to the blanks furnished.

SEC. 6. Any teacher wishing to resign, shall give in writing at least two weeks 10 ice to the Board.

Sec. 7. The pay of a supernumerary shall be the salary of the regular teacher whose place is supplied. This amount shall be paid to the supernumerary on a warrant issued by the Board in the same manner that other salaries are paid, but no teacher shall receive any pay whatever for lost time.

SEC. 8. Teachers shall, at all times, exercise great care to secure as thorough ventilation as possible, and never fail to open doors and windows at recess, and especially during physical ex-

SEC. 9. Each and every teacher shall be requested to subscribe for, take and read, at least one periodical devoted to educational work.

SEC. 10. Any teacher absent from school on account of sickness, or other necessity, shall send immediate notice Removal! thereof to the principal who shall appoint a supernumerary to take temporary charge of said teachers school room. Sec. 11. Teachers are responsible

for the care of the property belonging to their departments. SEC. 12. Thermometers will be

kept suspended from the ceilings. Sec. 13. Teachers shall not help, or assist pupils of other departments than their own without the consent of

the teacher of said department. SEC. 14. Each teacher shall be held directly responsible to the principal for the management of the department under the control of such teacher.

DUTIES OF PUPILS.

Section 1. Pupils whose parents or guardians shall create a disturbance in school, or shall censure, abuse or insult any teacher in the presence of the class, or on the school premises, or who shall write abusive or insulting letters to any teacher, shall be liable to suspension.

SEC. 2. All pupils shall be required to pass out of the school rooms during goods. the noon and recess , as except in incle ment weather or in cases of delicate health.

Sec. 3. Pupils shall not be per. mitted, during school bours or the noon or recess to visit other school rooms than their own, except by special permission of their teachers.

in any way injure the school property shall replace or repair the same immediately, or stand suspended until the rule is obeyed; such suspension shall not take the usual course unless the refusal is prolonged.

SEC. 5. For the purpose of enforc-ing proper discipline and maintaining order among the pupils, the school authorities and teachers shall be deemed to have jurisdiction over them on their way to and from school.

Sec. 6. Pupils are required to attend all examinations, and shall not be transferred or promoted from one grade or class to higher one until they have passed a satisfactory examination in all the branches taught in the department from which they go, except by permission of the principal.

SEC. 7. No pupil who shall leave

school, or be withdrawn therefrom for a supposed grievance of any kind, shall be permitted to enter again without the consent of the principal and board.
