**STATE NEWS.**

Lane county has three citizens over 90 years of age. One man, J. B. Gagnier, 84 years old, has lived in Oregon sixty-five years.

The wheat crop of Oregon, Washington and Idaho this year aggregates to 23,000,000 bushels, as against 17,000,000 bushels for last year.

Judge Deady has granted the O. & C. railroad authority to cut rates from Corvallis to San Francisco, to meet the opposition of the Oregon Pacific.

A material reduction has been made by the Oregon Railway and Navigation Company in the price of their lands in Oregon and Washington Territory.

The Brown case cost Klamath county several thousand dollars, and the expense of building the new bridge, which will amount to a considerable sum, will swell the indebtedness of the county to about \$12,000.

Chinamen are leaving Portland fast. All the berths on the ship Colona, which sails about the 20th, were taken long ago. About 120 Chinamen left for San Francisco a few days since with tickets for Hong Kong by the Pacific Mail Steamship company's steamers.

It appears that nothing is to come of all the talk about the lease of the lines of the Oregon Railway and Navigation Company by the Northern Pacific and the Union Pacific. The Oregon Railway and the Navigation Company's earnings show a constant increase, and its directors are satisfied to let well enough alone.

It is stated on good authority in railroad circles that the Oregon Pacific proposes to commence work in a month on its eastern extension to Boise City, I. T., there to connect with the Chicago and Northwestern from the east. The opinion prevails to some extent that trains will run into Yaquina City, overland, on June 15th next.

Bob Atchinson, an Irishman of Yamhill, has a family that is a fortune in itself. His three grown-up daughters are beautiful specimens of the national oddity called Albino, so indispensable to the museum or side-show. The girls are as white as a lily. Their quite heavy hair is almost white, eye lashes and eyebrows colorless, eyes pink and their skin is as soft and velvety as it is white.

According to the census taken by the Assessor, Jackson county has a population of over 9,000. Ashland has about 1200, Jacksonville 900 and Medford 500. These figures are as correct as they well can be; but it is the general supposition that there are many hundred more people in the county than reported. To take the census accurately and fully several months should be exclusively devoted thereto.

The Roseburg Review may console itself with the reflection that it is in no way responsible for the extra session of the legislature. It labored long and earnestly with the Governor, exhorting him to stand firm against the councils of the bad men who want a Republican Senator elected; but it is another case of "love's labor lost," and there is danger of the "Review" "sonning" toward the Governor who wouldn't place himself under the protection of its friendly direction.—Tidings.

Recently a Colorado lady found it in the possession of a Cheyenne Indian, and by writing to the Cheynes of South Manchester, Conn., succeeded in restoring it to the owner. In a novel, who would not have laughed at the romance that might have been built on such an incident.—Hartford Post.

The Raleigh (N. C.) News (Dem.) is one of the many Southern papers which loyally support the President in his reform policy. It says: "The views of the President on the subject of civil service reform will coincide with those of the great mass of Democrats throughout the country. The President will be sustained in this matter, so far as in all others of importance so far, by the members of his party without considerable exception." The Washington Post (Dem.) says: "That Mr. Cleveland will be upheld by the serious and patriotic sentiment of the country is a conclusion not to be escaped."

Mr. H. Kenton of Albany, who has recently perfected a sluicing machine for separating fine gold from the black sand of the sea-coast, is now trying it on the Yaquina beach. The machine consists of a series of sluice boxes, lined with copper, and armed with magnets beneath the copper. The black sand consists principally of iron, which being held by the magnets, affords an easy means of separating the gold from it. The machine has been tried in Southern Oregon with most satisfactory results, and in the test upon the sands of the Yaquina beach, which are known to abound in fine particles of gold, the experiments will be regarded with interest.

In some sections of country this is an intolerable nuisance. We have seen them in fields of grain where hand binding would be impossible without back-sick gloves, and then attended with some inconvenience. A Michigan farmer adopts a novel mode of eradication. It consists of placing salt upon them when young, when sheep will gnaw them close to the ground. If they start again renew the operation. Another mode is to wait until they are well-grown and the stalks are hollow, and then cut them just before a rain or shower. The stalks fill with water, causing the decay of the root.—German town Telegraph.
