Remember kindly your Alma Mater. With her welfare and reputation your future career is closely—almost vitally interdependent. Render back to her something for what she has done for you—something in the shape of brilliant literary effort, or distinguished professional success.

Be just to your brethren of the profession; protect their reputation as you would protect your own. Do your part towards the removal of the jealousies and ungenerous rivalries that not infrequently disgrace our profession.

Investing with the degree of Doctor of Medicine ought not to mark the stopping-place of your studies; on the contrary it should act as an incentive to further and deeper investigation. Remember that as yet you are but neophytes standing in the vestibule of the temple and that only after earnest effort and patient toil, you shall be qualified to enter the inner shrine.
