WASHINGTON, June 14, 1886.

Having entered upon the seventh month of the first session of the forty-ninth Congress, the lower House proposes to make an effort to crowd the work through within the time consumed by the session ending July 15, 1886.

The president and his wife have contemplated a tour of the northern lakes with a select party of friends in a chartered steamer, during the summer.

The liquor dealers of Massachusetts propose, it is said, to boycott all dealers who do not join their league.

The wealth of twenty-six senators is given at \$162,000,000. It was probably these millions and not their merits which elected them.

UNITED STATES troops, guarding Gen. Grant's tomb at Riverside park, will be withdrawn June 30th.

It is said that the president and his wife have never been farther west than the city of Buffalo. Mr. Cleveland is quite anxious to make a tour to the lakes, and if he does so, the Chicago Iroquois Club, to which he has a standing invitation, will doubtless entertain him.
