## FOOD FOR MAN.

The old saying that what is one man's meat is another man's poison is realized in the opposite tastes of people.

The Turks shudder at the thought of eating oysters.

The Digger Indians of the Pacific slope rejoice in the great locust swarms of 1875 as a dispensation of the Great Spirit, and laid in a store of dried locust powder sufficient to last them for several years.

The French will eat frogs, snails and the diseased livers of geese, but draw the line at alligators.

Buckland declares the taste of locusts to be good, and much like veal.

Quass, the fermented cabbage water of the Russians is their popular tipple. It is described as resembling a mixture of stale fish and soap suds in taste, yet next to beer, it has more virtues than any other fermented beverage. A tallow candle washed down with quass forms a meal that it would be hard to be thankful for.

In Canton and other Chinese cities rats are sold at the rate of \$2 a dozen, and the hind quarters of dogs are hung up in the butchers' shops alongside of mutton and lamb, but they command a higher price. The edible birds' nest of the Chinese are worth twice their weight in silver, the finest variety selling for as much as \$30 a pound.

The negroes of the West Indies eat baked snakes and palm worms fried in their own fat, but they can not be induced to eat steamed rabbits.

In Mexico parrots are eaten, but they are rather tough.

The Guachos of the Badda Oriental are in the habit of hunting skunks for the sake of their flesh.

The octopus, or devil-fish, when boiled and then roasted, is eaten in Corsica and esteemed a delicacy.

In the Pacific Islands and West Indies lizards' eggs are eaten with gusto. The natives of the Antilles eat alligator eggs, and the eggs of the turtle are popular everywhere, though up to the commencement of the last century turtle was only eaten by the poor of Jamaica.

Ants are eaten by various nations. In Brazil they are served with a resinous sauce, and in Africa they are stewed with grease or butter. The East Indians catch them in pits and carefully wash them in handfulls like raisins. In Siam a curvy of ants' eggs is a costly luxury.

The Ceylonese eat the bees after robbing them of their honey.

Chatterpillars and spiders are dainties to the African bushman.

After they have wound the silk from the cocoon the Chinese eat the chrysalis of the silk worm.

Spiders roasted are a sort of desert with the new Caladonians.

**THE ADVANTAGES OF A BUSINESS EDUCATION.**

Address of Oscar N. Benedict at the closing of Roseburg Public School exercises, June 20.

The advantages of a business education are as numerous as the stars in heaven; but are within the comprehension of any man or woman who desires to understand them. Life itself is so intimately connected with business transactions that the bulk of it may be said to be a continued series of gains and losses. It is only when we carefully enter into the details of these that we can with any degree of surety rely upon an ultimate gain. How can one succeed in this world of receipts and disbursements without a record of them, which record is in itself the best system of book-keeping? How can a man succeed in business without a constant thorough knowledge of the exact condition of his business? Too many farmers and other good men who fail to keep books are too much surprised on day of settlement. If more of them knew the exact condition of their business they would less frequently over reach themselves. If a reliable business record could be referred to at any time the man would be more economical, the wife who so often is considered expensive would upon witnessing the enormous liabilities encumbered be more frugal, debts would be paid; more people would have happy homes; and I think that when the final day of settlement will come with each of us and it will be seen upon closing that great ledger of personal accounts between man and man that we are even with the business world, and we owe no man anything; it will be a source of great pleasure to our friends to have it said of us "no creditor was left to mourn his departure."

Whoever seriously studies any of the problems of the time is speedily confronted by the drink evil. It swallows the savings of operatives: it furnishes the foundation for a political corruption which threatens disaster to the State; it contracts the labors of the churches; it baffles philanthropy; it re-enforces socialism and the commune; it keeps the lowest classes brutal and dangerous; and those next in order Philistine and material in a thousand subtle ways, by direction and indirection, purposely and of instinct, it acts and re-acts against the progress of humanity, everywhere, rendering more unresponsive the masses whose regeneration is being attempted.—New York Tribune.

## WASHINGTON LETTER.

WASHINGTON, June 7, 1886.

Now that the President's marriage de facto has relieved the press and public from the strain of surmises and guesses it can pull itself together and turn its attention to affairs political, social, and religious.

At the Capitol Mr. Manning's letter of resignation was regarded as just the thing that any high-minded official would do in the circumstances. An officer even temporarily disabled should free the hands of his chief to make any arrangements necessary, so that the Department might not suffer. The President's letter in reply is also regarded as an eminently proper one.

A few there were who seemed inclined to make the correspondence as implying a virtual termination of Mr. Manning's connection with the Treasury. Their reason for their belief is that Mr. Manning will never be the same man again and never will have control of the Treasury Department. This view they persist in holding, notwithstanding Mr. Manning's very rapid and continuous improvement, and in the face of the doctor's expressed opinion that Mr. Manning could resume work to-day without much risk.

That Secretary Manning will return to the Cabinet is earnestly hoped by those who have enjoyed the cordial hospitality and unswerving friendliness of Mrs. Manning during their residence here. Although fond of society, and certainly well calculated to shine pre-eminently in it, Mrs. Manning quickly gave up her desire to go out to any extent last winter, when the Secretary found his business cares had encroached even upon the hours he had to spend at home. Since his illness, Mrs. Manning has been devoted in her attention, and was anxious until she secured the Secretary's promise not to think of returning to work until after the summer's rest. Secretary and Mrs. Manning left here yesterday for the Warm Springs, Va., but their summer plans will depend entirely upon the progress made by the former toward recovery.

The sensation at the Capitol during the week was a speech made by Judge Fullerton, of New York, in favor of the payment by the United States of the rebel war debt, and it will be a long time before we hear the last of it. It was suggested that the Republican Congressional committee may have employed this distinguished attorney to appear before his committee on War Claims, to advocate a measure that is prohibited by the Constitution, but I know he came, as any other lawyer would, to earn a fee. The stupid bankers of Amsterdam, Holland, who hold several carloads of Confederate bonds, employed that celebrated philosopher, Rufus Hatch, Esq., to see what could be done about the redemption of these securities, and Uncle Rufus probably told them that it was only necessary to have a bill introduced in Congress, which he would attend to. The bill was introduced by Mr. Merriman, who hadn't the slightest idea that it meant what it is construed to mean, and then Uncle Rufus paid Judge Fullerton \$1,000 to come over and make a speech in support of it. The committee was panic stricken when they found what they had under consideration, but they let Fullerton finish his speech and earn his fee. This incident will doubtless be discussed upon the stump by every Republican campaign speaker, as a proof that the Rebels have captured the capital again. There seems to be a settled conviction among Government clerks that after the adjournment of Congress there will be a wholesale discharge. They think that now the heads of departments fear to make any changes because they apprehend that such action would retard the progress of their appropriation bills. The officials say on the quiet that the clerks are not far from right in their conjectures. The only departments in which any degree of safety can be left are the State and War. Even the Navy Department will undergo a pruning process, and many clerks who have outlived their usefulness will have to give way to efficient Democrats. The discharges in the Treasury Department will, of course, be more numerous than in any of the others, and its clerks will count the days that intervene before the adjournment of Congress with anxiety. A prominent official of the Treasury Department said a few days ago that in a few months the force would be so changed that the regular visitors will think themselves in a strange place when they come within its walls.
