A CONSISTENT PRESIDENT.

The following from the Jacksonville Times is certainly to the point, and harmonizes with our views precisely: The Republicans organs and strikers have all along been charging President Cleveland with inconsistency, saying that he was removing Republican office-holders for offensive partisanship, while he permitted Democratic officials to commit the very same acts the others were removed for. Of course there was no foundation for this, and for the purpose of emphasizing his views and intentions in this matter, he has just issued the following warning to his subordinates:

EXECUTIVE MANSION, Washington, D. C., July 14, 86.

To Heads of Departments in the Service of the General Government: I deem this a proper time to especially warn all subordinates in the several departments, and all office-holders under the general government, against the use of their official positions in attempts to control political movements in their localities. Office-holders are agents of the people, not their masters. Not only is their time and labor due to the government, but they should scrupulously avoid in their political action, as well as in the discharge of their duty, offending by a display of obtrusive partisanship their neighbors who have relations with them.

As public officials they should constantly remember that their party friends from whom they have received preferment have not invested them with the power of arbitrarily managing political affairs. They have no right, as office-holders, to dictate the action of their party associates, or to throttle freedom of action within party lines by methods and practices which prevent every useful and justifiable purpose of party organization. The influence of federal offices should not be felt in the manipulation of political primary meetings and nominating conventions. The use of these officials of their positions to compass their selections as delegates to political conventions is indecent and unfair, and a proper regard for the proprieties and requirements of political places will also prevent their assuming the active conduct of political campaigns.

A just discrimination in this regard between the things a citizen may properly do and the purposes for which a public office should not be used is easy, in the light of a correct appreciation of the relations between the people and those entrusted with official place, and consideration of the necessity under our form of government of political action free from official coercion.

You are requested to communicate the substance of these views to those for whose guidance they are intended.

GROVER CLEVELAND.

Consistency, Thou art a Jewel.

The refusal to confirm Mr. Mathews, the colored Democrat whom President Cleveland nominated for Recorder in the District of Columbia, shows that whatever rights were conferred upon the negro by the amended constitution the right to be a Democrat was not one of them in the opinion of Republican Senators. No doubt was entertained of Mr. Mathews' honesty or capacity. The color of his skin and his politics defeated him. Only last month another instance of the prejudice against the advancement of the colored people was shown in Vincennes, Ind., in the refusal of a number of young ladies to graduate from the public school, because a young colored girl who had passed the required examination aspired to the same honor. Now if this last had occurred "down South," old John Sherman, Hoar and the "rest of 'em" would have wept oceans of tears for the persecuted graduate, but as long as it occurred north of Mason & Dixon's line the Republican papers are as mum as they have been over the pension frauds. Verily, "consistency, thou art a jewel," and our Republican brethren are diamonds of the first water.

SENATOR MITCHELL, of this state, has dipped into the much-discussed John Roach matter. On the 6th inst. he submitted a proposed amendment to the general deficiency bill to provide for the payment to John Roach & Son of \$20,270 for wharfage and care of the monitor Roanoke from March 17, 1877, to the time of its sale in 1883, including towing, pilage, etc., also to pay them \$38,840 in full for the cost of changing thereon the frame of the turret.

CONGRESS will adjourn in a few days without doubt, and the good news is that the River and Harbor bill has passed both Houses, and we have no misgiving as to the signature of the President being attached.
