THE COMMENCEMENT. Essays and Orations Delivered by the Graduating Class of the Roseburg Public School, on Friday May 31, 1889. VALUE OF CHARACTER. By Lena Willis.

Would we have our names enrolled with the great we must have character of our own. In some instances men may irrespective of their own merits receive tokens of honor. It is much easier to acquire money than character. Wealth may to a certain degree command respect, but in an intelligent community nothing is so valued as character.

It is but a poor passport here to say that you had ancestors who were distinguished. In some cases it is a disadvantage because more is expected of such a one. A person may have a fine reputation, but a very poor character; while on the other hand one may have a bad reputation and a good character.

Those who possess character will create friends, gather enough of earth's treasures, and open a sure way to happiness and honor. No one can estimate the real value of a character until it is once lost. Once lost so easily; yet more than a lifetime may be required to regain it.

A good name may be injured but if you once merit a bad name no matter where you go, it will follow you. If we are sufficiently watchful over our own actions, we shall have no time to find fault with the conduct of others.

The life of Franklin was marked by propriety as well as by self-respect. He possessed more moral greatness than appeared to the incredulous. The character of Washington is one which every young American should emulate.

It should always be kept in mind, not as a terror, but as a kindness of our wise Heavenly Father we cannot know the day nor the hour, in which our brief career will end, and the gates of eternity will open for us.
