all newspaper writers aspire to reach. Some other American editors have reached The local reporter whose work is in fine print can generally prepare a column in an hour and a half to two hours. Re porters are frequently paid by the column in the large cities. The one cent papers often pay no more than \$3 a column. At that rate the reporter earns \$20 to \$25 week and finds his own material. H


