How Rev. M. Spaulding was Saved. Mr. Edward Crate, sr, is the oldest resident in the city, having passed through where The Dalles now stands forties. He relates a page of unwritten print. Soon after the Whitman massacre at Wailstpu, Father Brouliette went to meet Rev. Spaulding and warn him of the danger. He met him coming from the Lapwai agency, and told him to get to Ft. Walla Walla as soon as possible. He burried on to the fort-now Wallulaand Mr. Crate took him and his family in a canoe, and nurriedly paddled them across the river; but not a minute too soon, for when they were in mid-stream a large number of hostile Indians appeared on the banks and commenced to shoot their poisoned arrows at Mr. Spaulding and his family. Mr. Crate was a master hand with a boat, and kept on the opposite side of the stream, out of range of the deadly missiles. He had the native hardihood of the voyageurs, and kept on with his canoe until he reached the settlements and all danger was passed. If Father Brouliette had not intercepted Rev. Mr. Spaulding he would have shared the fate of Dr. Whit man, and if he had arrived at the fort a half-hour later he would never have lived to show his gratitude to his rescuers A short space of time, hardly incalculable, saved him from the merciless tomahawk of the savages, and the bravery and skill of the old Canadian voyageur-Mr. Edward Crate, sr., for long years a resident of this city-brought him to civilization and security. 




